## Demolition of roadside structures starts in Tangail

Tangail district administration with the help of Roads and Highways Department (RHD) yesterday started demolishing illegal structures on roadside land at different places in the town.

The drive started in the morning and around 200 illegal structures from Shamsul Haque Gate to LGED Intersection were demolished till the afternoon.

RHD workers and employees, in the presence of law enforcers, knocked down hotels, restaurants, tea stalls, workshops and other structures beside the

Tangail-Mymensingh Road at Shamsul Haque Gate, Tangail Medical College, New Bus Terminal and LGED Intersection areas.

The structures were hampering the movement of patients coming to the hospital and creating other problems in the areas, district administration sources said.

Moreover, the illegal structures were causing unwanted gathering and also acute traffic jam near the New Bus Terminal, they added.

Executive Magistrate Abdur Rahim Sujon led the demolition drive. He told this correspondent that the drive was conducted under

Section 5(2) of Land and Building (grabbing recovery/dakhol punorudhar) Act of 1970.

Before resuming demolition of the illegal structures, the authorities had served notices and also made a public announcement, directing the owners to remove their illegal structures from roadside areas, the magistrate said.

During the drive, the authorities did not fine any of the occupiers but warned them verbally, he added.

Among others, Executive Engineer of RHD in Tangail Noor-a-Alam and Assistant Engineer Ramjan Ali were present during the drive.

"A section of dishonest

people have been running businesses by erecting illegal structures on government land beside the busy roads at different places in the town for long," Mohammad Mahbub Hossain, deputy commissioner of Tangail, told this correspondent.

"Earlier, the district administration had demolished illegal structures in the same areas in August last year, but the occupiers returned within a few months and started constructing makeshift structures, the DC said.

District administration sources said the drive will continue until all illegal structures are removed.

## Rape of college girl sparks outcry in Pabna

Rape of a college girl of Punduria village in Santhia upazila under the district has sparked protest.

The 21-year-old victim, a second year student of history department of Pabna Edward College, was gang-raped on Sunday. She is now undergoing treatment at Pabna Medical College Hospital.

"When I was going to attend a religious programme in the area on Sunday night, a gang of 4/5 raped me," the girl told this correspondent at the hospital bed yesterday.

The victim's father filed a case, accusing four people, said Officer-in-charge of Santhia Police Station Nasir Uddin.

The accused include Faridul Islam and Hafizul Islam, residents of the village, the OC said, adding that they went into hiding soon after the incident.

Teachers and students of the college demanded immediate arrest and exemplary punishment of the rapists of the girl belonging to a Hindu family at the village.

They will stage demonstration in the town today to realise the demand, said Humayun Kabir, principal

of the college.

In Meherpur, a five-year old girl has been raped at Dhola village in Gangni upazila of the district, reports our Kushtia correspondent.

OC Akram Hossain of Gangni Police Station said one Parvej Ali, a nasimom driver, allured the girl promising her sweetmeat, took her to a nearby field and

raped her.

The victim's father filed a case, accusing Parvej, the OC said, adding that they are raiding different areas to arrest the culprit.

## Woman, lover get death penalty for husband's murder

A Jessore court yesterday sentenced a woman and her lover to death for killing her husband in 2014.

The convicts are Sabana Khatun, wife of victim Abdur Razzak of Ajmatpur village in Chowgachha upazila of Jessore, and her lover Abdul Ali.

Judge Sharif Hossain of Jessore Additional Sessions Judge's Court also fined them Tk 50,000 each.

According to the prosecu-

tion, Sabana along with Ali killed Razzak on March 9 in 2004 as the victim protested his wife's extramarital relation.

The brother of the deceased Mintu Miah filed a case with Chowgachha Police Station in this connection the same day.

On June 9 the same year, police submitted charge sheet against Sabana and her boyfriend Ali.

After examining witnesses and evidence, the judge found them guilty and pronounced the verdict.

### SHIMUL MURDER CASE

## Four of 9 accused sent to jail on surrender

A Mymensingh court yesterday rejected bail petitions of four accused in Shimul murder case and sent them to jail.

They are prime accused Nurul Kabir, 45, his brother Humayun Kabir Bhutto, 43, and their relatives Manu, 35, and Shuvo, 33.

They surrendered before the Cognisance Court No-1 and sought bail. Judge Ahsan Habib rejected their bail prayers and sent them to jail, court sources said.

There was a feud between Bhutto and his cousin Samiul Hasan Rony of Digarkanda area in the town over payment of dues, police said.

On the night of February 6, Rony along with some of his friends went to Bhutto's

house at Digarkanda and asked for the money. Bhutto, his brother Nurul Kabir, Manu and Shuvo locked in an altercation with Rony and a scuffle broke out between the two groups, locals said.

At one stage, Bhutto and Kabir fired several shots that hit Shimul and Sohan, who had gone to the area for personal reasons, they added.

Hearing screams, locals rushed to the spot and took them to MMCH where doctors declared Shimul dead at around 11:30pm.

Shimul's mother Firoza Begum lodged a case with the Kotwali Police Station the following day, accusing nine people, including Kabir, Bhutto, Manu and Shuvo.

The five other accused are still at large.

## 113 Hezbut men held after Monday's clash in Noakhali

Law enforcers arrested at least 113 supporters of Hezbut Tawheed following Monday's clash between Hezbut men and the villagers of Porkara in Sonaimuri upazila of the district that killed three people.

The arrestees were produced in a court that sent them to jail, said police.

Two cases were filed in connection with the incident, said Kazi Haniful Islam, officer-in-charge of Sonaimuri Police Station.

Two alleged members of Hezbut Tawheed and a local were killed and 150 others, including several policemen, injured in a clash between villagers and the Hezbut men over building a mosque for the

Islamist group in Sonaimuri upazila on Monday morning.

The deceased are Hezbut activists Ibrahim Khan Rubel, 27, son of Nurul Haque, and Mohammad Solaiman, 24, of the village, and Mujibul Haque Mujib, 50, of Khodkhasta village in the upazila.

Mujib was shot dead, while stab marks were found on the bodies of the two other deceased, said police.

Superintendent of Police Elias Sharif said there had been a longstanding conflict between the Hezbut members and the villagers of Pourkara as they believed that the Hezbut men, followers of its founder Bayezid Khan Panni, was "propagating against Islam".

On February 24, the

Hezbut men held a public meeting near Chashirhat Union Parishad and made some "derogatory comments about Islam", which angered the villagers, said police.

Around 11:00am on Monday, when the Hezbut activists had gathered at Pourkara to resume the construction work of the mosque, which was abandoned several years ago following protests by locals, the villagers rushed to the spot and asked them to stop their work. This triggered an altercation between the Hezbut men and the locals.

At one stage, locals, equipped with rods and sticks, swooped on the Hezbut men and a fierce fight took place between the two sides.
