

Prominent actor and director Afzal Hossain has made a film based on the first story of the series, "Cox's Bazar-e Kakatua". The film has recently received release certificate from the Censor Board.

Besides directing, Afzal has played the lead role in the film, while the full cast

Zahiruddin Piyash, Shimanto and others. Marking the birth anniversary of Father of the Nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the film will see its world premiere today at 3:05pm on Channel i. From the next day, March 18, the film will run at major theatre halls including Blockbuster Cinemas at Jamuna Future Park in the capital.

# Tim Burton's next film looks enchanting

There are few directors who can mix endearing and weird quite as well as Tim Burton. Now, the man behind "Big Fish" and "Edward Scissorhands" is back with another story that looks to be equal parts sweet and scary. "Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children", starring Eva Green as the titular Miss Peregrine, just released its first trailer.

In the film, Green runs a home which feels like the cultured English version of Xavier's School for Gifted Youngsters. The description is even more fitting considering the screenplay was written by Jane Goldman, the screenwriter of "X-Men: First Class".

Based on the series of books by Ransom Riggs, Asa Butterfield plays Jake, a boy who befriends the children at the house, but is apparently normal: except he isn't. Some of the children have very X-Men like abilities like invisibility or being able to fly. Others, on

the other hand, are just incredibly strange. There's much more going on, however, as the children are being threatened and it's Jake's job to act as their protector. It's unclear




exactly what they want, but it appears that the forces of evil are being led by Samuel L Jackson.

In addition to Green and Jackson, the film also boasts a cast that includes Dame Judi Dench, Rupert Everett, and Allison Janney, and promises to have its darkness but also be

full of bright and beautiful images.

As the book series currently has two more entries, this could very well mark the beginning of a new franchise, with a release date of September 30.
