UK firm asks for Tk 58cr for 6 months

Talks on with another company

British company Redline Assured Security has demanded Tk 58 crore for overall security management at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport for six months while negotiation with another British company, Restrata, was going on yesterday.

Redline and Restrata have been primarily selected from a list of four foreign security companies suggested by British High Commissioner Alison Blake during a meeting with Bangladesh government high-ups at the Prime Minister Office on March 13.


Two other companies on the list are G4S and Westminster Security Services.

Initially, a company will be appointed for six months and, if needed, its tenure might be increased, said a top official of civil aviation and tourism ministry.

Its job will cover security management, quality control in civil aviation, Aviation Security (AVSEC) screeners training, infrastructural development and cargo security.

Officials of Redline and Restrata were now in Dhaka. The authorities started negotiations with Restrata on Wednesday and with Redline the previous day.

AL MP flouts rules, seeks votes for party nominees

Violating electoral law, a ruling Awami League lawmaker in Jhalakathi yesterday sought votes for partynominated chairman candidates in the union parishad polls scheduled for Tuesday.

The BNP, meanwhile, alleged that AL men attacked and harassed its candidates and supporters in some districts. Violence also took places in a few union parishads, centring on the polls.

Lawmaker of Jhalakathi-2 constituency Bazlul Haque Haroon attended three public meetings at Kahtalia upazila, organised to mark the birth anniversary of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and National Children's Day yesterday.

He sought votes in every meeting in favour of "boat," the electoral symbol of the ruling party.

Trump victory a major global risk

Says Economist Intelligence Unit report

The prospect of Donald Trump winning the US presidency represents a global threat on a par with jihadist militancy destabilising the world economy, according to British research group EIU.

In the latest version of its Global Risk assessment, the Economist Intelligence Unit ranked victory for the Republican front-runner at 12 on an index where the current top threat is a Chinese economic "hard landing" rated 20.

Justifying the threat level, the EIU highlighted the tycoon's alienation towards China as well as his comments on Islamist extremism, saying a proposal to stop Muslims from entering the United States would be a "potent recruitment tool for jihadi groups".

It also raised the spectre of a trade war under a Trump presidency and pointed out that his policies "tend to be prone to constant revision". "He has been exceptionally hostile towards free trade, including notably

NAFTA (the North American Free Trade Agreement), and has repeatedly labelled China as a 'currency manipulator'." it said. "He has also taken an exceptionally right-wing stance on the Middle East

and jiadhi terrorism, including, among other things, advocating the killing of families of terrorists and launching a land incursion into Syria to wipe out IS (and acquire its oil)."

By comparison it gave a possible armed clash in the South China Sea an eight -- the same as the threat posed by Britain leaving the European Union -- and ranked an emerging market debt crisis at 16. A Trump victory, it said, would at least scupper the Trans-Pacific

Pigeon patrol to measure London air pollution

Ten pigeons armed with air pollution detectors on their backs were released into the London sky on Wednesday to monitor pollution in the British capital, organisers of the initiative told AFP.

Equipped with GPS devices and pollution sensors to monitor nitrogen dioxide and ozone levels, the birds dubbed the "Pigeon Air Patrol" were released from Primrose Hill, a wealthy area in north London.

The data they collect can be followed on the website pigeonairpatrol.com, said Romain Lacombe, founder of the French start-up Plume Labs, who started the project with Pierre Duquesnoy of DigitasLBi.

Girl beaten to death over trivial matter

A schoolgirl, who was critically injured after being beaten allegedly by her cousin over a trifling matter in Madhupur upazila on Wednesday, died early yesterday.

The dead, Mousumi Akter, 13, was the daughter of Mofiz Uddin of Dakkhin Laofula village. She was a class-VI student at a local high school.

Mofiz alleged that his elder brother's son Sujon was locked in an altercation with his daughter, claiming that a goat of Mousumi damaged brinjal plants of Sujon.

At one stage, Sujon became furious and hit Mousumi in the head with a stick, leaving her seriously wounded, he added.

Mousumi was admitted to Madhupur Upazila Health Complex where she died around 2:00am yesterday.

5 Jubo League men killed in road crash

Bus hits their 3-wheeler in Meherpur

Five activists of Mujibnagar Jubo League were killed after their vehicle collided head-on with a picnic bus in Meherpur last night.

The accident happened when a group of Jubo League men were returning to their home in Bagoan village from a programme, marking the 97th birthday of Bangabandhu and National Children's Day, in the district town, police said.

Sheikh Mustafizur Rahman, assistant superintendent of police in Meherpur, said a diesel-run three wheeler, locally known as algamon, and a picnic bus had a head-on collision on Meherpur-Mujibnagar road in Chokshyamnagar area of Mujibnagar around 7:30pm, killing three people on the spot and injuring at least 10 others.

One of the injured died on his way to Meherpur General Hospital, he said.

Touhidul Islam, joint secretary of Mujibnagar Jubo League, said another injured died when he was being taken to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital (RMCH).

He identified all the five victims as activists of Jubo League, the youth body of ruling Awami League.

After the accident, angry locals set fire to the picnic bus, which was heading towards a coaching centre at Sujanagar in Pabna from Mujibnagar Memorial Complex. However,
