



586 migrants rescued off Libya coast

Italian navy rescues 900 more; missions yet to confirm if any Bangladeshis among them

Nine migrants trying to reach Europe were drowned off Libya and hundreds more, mostly from sub-Saharan African countries and Bangladesh, were rescued off the port of Zawiya, west of Tripoli, the Red Crescent said yesterday.

Libyan authorities said they had rescued the migrants from four rickety boats, one of which sank. Colonel Ayoub Qassem, spokesman for the Libyan navy,

said a total of 586 migrants were rescued during the operations. They included 11 children and 60 women, and were mainly Bangladeshis and Sudanese, he told AFP.

Libyan Navy and Red Cross gave no details of the nationalities of the victims or those rescued.

The drowning deaths came just days after four migrants were killed in a boat fire off Libya and another 187 rescued.

Meanwhile, Italy's coast guard said more than 900 migrants were rescued in four separate operations in the Strait of Sicily on Saturday.

The coast guard has continued to pick up migrants in trouble in the stretch of water between the southern coast of Italy and North Africa.

3 killed as 2 buses smash car

Three of a family, including two women, were killed as two buses rammed their car from behind one after another in the capital's Khilkhet area yesterday.

The dead are Delwar Hossain Mojumder, 58, of Chandpur, his sister Anwara Milon Begum, 45, and her daughter Lovely, 23, of Gazipur.

The victims were coming to Dhaka from Gazipur for treatment of Delwar, a retired government official, who was suffering from cardiac complications, said Shahidur Rahman, subinspector of Khilkhet Police Station.

Delwar came to his sister's house in Gazipur from his hometown Chandpur to consult a doctor in Dhaka. His sister and niece were taking him to the doctor, said Kudrat-e-Khuda, assistant commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police (Cantonment zone).

With elections due in 732 union parishads tomorrow, one man was killed and scores others were injured in pre-polls violence in different places of the country yesterday.

Candidates, vying for different posts in the lowest tier of the local government, wrapped up their campaigns 11:59pm last night. Voting will begin at 8:00am and continue till 4:00pm tomorrow in the

UPs that are going to polls tomorrow in the first of the six-phase elections. Restrictions on the movement of motorised vehicles will be in place for 24 hours since midnight tonight. Some 1.8 lakh law enforcers would be deployed across the country to maintain law and order during the polls, said Inspector General of Police

(IGP) AKM Shahidul Hoque. In the subsequent phases, elections are due in 643 UPs on March 31 and in 681 UPs on April 23. Around 2,200 UPs will go to polls in three more



CARGO VESSEL CAPSIZE

Govt yet to start rescue operation in Shela

No rescue effort has been made in more than 24 hours after a coal-laden cargo vessel sank in the Shela river flowing through the Sundarbans, a Unesco-listed world heritage site in Bagerhat.

Only a red flag was hoisted yesterday at the spot near the Harintana forest station to caution other vessels plying the route.

With 1,235 tonnes of coal, MV Sea Horse

sank on Saturday afternoon while going to Nowapara, Jessore from Chittagong. The bottom of its hull cracked when it reached the Sundarbans' Chandpai range under Mongla upazila.

The movement of cargo vessels on the route has remained normal following the

incident, the authorities said. The forest department and the Bagerhat district administration, meanwhile, have
