Blast at Lahore park kills 65

Witnesses said they saw body parts More than 300 other people were strewn across the parking lot once the dust had settled after the blast.

"When the blast occurred, the flames area of Gulshan-e-Iqbal Park close to chil- were so high they reached above the trees and I saw bodies flying in the air," said Hasan Imran, 30, a resident who had gone to Gulshan-e-Iqbal Park for a walk.

India qualified for the World Twenty20 semifinals and knocked out Australia after Virat Kohli smashed an unbeaten 82 in their do-ordie showdown in Mohali on Sunday.

Kohli's powerful 51-ball knock propelled India to a six-wicket victory, as they successfully chased down Australia's 160-6 to keep their dreams alive of becoming the first nation to win two World T20 titles.

The party will also discard the word Jamaat, they said.
