40 hurt as cops pummel unemployed nurses

Some 40 persons were allegedly injured after police charged baton, fired teargas canisters and used pepper spray, water cannons and sound grenades to disperse several hundred demonstrators blocking the capital's Shahbagh intersection yesterday protesting a circular of Monday seeking to recruit

Eleven detained persons were released later on giving undertakings that they will not stage protests, said Shahbagh Police Station Officer-incharge Abu Bakar Siddique. Of the injured, 22 were treated at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), including 14 in the burn unit for blisters inflicted by boiling water, alleged Bangladesh Diploma Bekar (unemployed) Nurses' Association Secretary General Faruk Hossain.

Talking to The Daily Star, he claimed

that cold water was also used intermittently along with pepper spray by police in plainclothes. However, the burn unit's Resident Surgeon Dr Partha Shankar Paul said they treated 10 persons and Dhaka Metropolitan Police Assistant Commissioner (Ramna zone) Shibli Noman denied the use of boiling water and pepper spray.

Traffic movement was normalised around 1:30pm, some three hours after the demonstrators of the association and Bangladesh Basic Graduate Nurses Society took to the streets.

This frustrated many unemployed nursing graduates hoping to be recruited based on their year of graduation, merit, and seniority.

"The government always recruited

nurses mainly on the basis of passing year...While the government recruited applicants from our previous batches, some of us had been waiting for 10 years," said Faruk.

The last recruitment was in 2013, said Momotaz Mahal, a diploma nurse graduating in 2006, adding that about half of her classmates were recruited that time while the rest have been waiting. "But now we have to compete with nurses who graduated last year," she said, adding that 21,000 nurses were unemployed at present. Senior graduates are unlikely to get jobs competing with

juniors, she apprehends. Additional Secretary to the health ministry Subhash Chandra Sarker said senior nurses were promoted as class II jobs in 2011. "...the recruitments must take place through BPSC examinations, according to the rules of the country," he said.

Newspapers, agencies must pay staff's income taxes

The Supreme Court yesterday upheld a wage board provision that instructed the owners of newspapers and news agencies to pay income tax of their journalists and employees.

The four-member bench of the Appellate Division gave the verdict after hearing an appeal filed by the government against a High Court judgment.

The HC in 1998 scrapped the provision of the fourth wage board that asked the media owners to pay their employees' income tax.

The HC had delivered the verdict following a writ petition filed by the owners of five national dailies -- the Ittefaq, the Sangbad, the Inqilab, the

University Student Murder in Ctg Five students held

CCTV identifies seven other attackers

Five students of Premier University, Chittagong were arrested yesterday in connection with the murder of Nasim Ahmed Sohel in Tuesday's attack by his rival faction of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists over a farewell and fresher's reception ceremony scheduled to be held today.

Nasim Ahmed Sohel A Chittagong court sent the five arrestees on a three-day remand. The arrestees -- Ashraful Islam, Wahidduzzaman Nishan, Ziaul Haider Chowdhury, SM Golam Mostafa, and Tamim-ul-Alam -- were identified in the CCTV footage collected from the university, said Mohammad Mainuddin, assistant commissioner (Kotwali) of Chittagong Metropolitan Police

(CMP).Aziz Ahmed, officer-in-charge of Chawkbazar Police Station, said they identified seven other attackers from the CCTV footage.

Emran Ahmed Imu, president of city unit BCL, claimed to The Daily Star that he watched the CCTV footage but found "no BCL men" among the attackers.

Sohel's father filed a case with the police on Tuesday night accusing 13 named persons and some 20 to 25 unidentified others.

However, leaders of a faction of Chittagong city unit BCL in a press conference at Chittagong Press Club gave a three-day ultimatum to arrest the murderers of Sohel, an MBA student of the university and demanded resignation of its Vice-Chancellor Dr Anupam Sen for his "failure" to protect Sohel.
