
Dulal leads the charge Grabs solo lead with 7-under; Locals in top 3 spots

nine birdies for two bogeys at the Kurmitola Golf Club yesterday to grab the outright lead in the 35-lakh-rupee event, co-sanctioned by Bangladesh Professional Golfers' Association and Professional Golf Tour of India.

Dulal was followed by two-time Asian Tour winner Siddikur Rahman and young local golfer Sajib Ali, both of whom returned a card of six-underpar (66) on Wednesday.

While Dulal traded nine birdies against three bogeys, Siddikur went bogeyless while racking up six birdies over the 18 holes.

Dulal, who came to limelight after scoring a record 63 at this course during the first Bashundhara Open last year, was delighted with the day's outcome.

"I got off to a good start with a birdie today and that put me in a good frame of mind. I just took all my opportunities thereafter. The four consecutive birdies gave me a lot of confidence that

Goetze leads Italy rout



Mario Goetze brushed off a frustrating season on Bayern Munich's bench to net in Germany's 4-1 thumping of Italy on Tuesday

as the world champions redeemed their England defeat.

Goetze, who scored the winner in the 2014 World Cup final, netted Germany's second goal against Italy at Bayern's Allianz Arena in Munich after Toni Kroos had put the hosts ahead.

Defender Jonas Hector and Arsenal midfielder Mesut Ozil netted in the second-half before replacement Stephan El Shaarawy scored Italy's late

consolation goal. The win, Germany's first over Italy for 21 years, boosts confidence four days after losing 3-2 to England in Berlin.

The win was a welcome tonic for Germany as head coach Joachim Loew made five changes from the team which threw away a two-goal lead against England.

Thomas Mueller set up Germany's first two goals and skippered his country for the first time on his 70th appearance.

Italy were disappointing having drawn 1-1 with defending European champions Spain last Thursday.

Their captain and goalkeeper Gianluigi Buffon won his 156th cap.

But the 38-year-old leaked four goals in Munich, just as he did for Juventus in their 4-2 defeat, and Champions League last 16 exit to Bayern, a fortnight ago.

Kroos gave Germany the lead when he fired Mueller's cross past Buffon on 24 minutes.

Germany doubled their tally on 44 minutes when Mueller chipped to Goetze, who shook off two defenders to head home.

Hector scored the third when Julian Draxler broke free of Bonacci, who eral secretary Abu Nayeem dropped to the turf, on 59 minutes.

Draxler sprinted clear and squared

for Hector to fire home with the Italy defence in tatters.

Buffon was lucky to stay on when he brought down Germany wing-back Sebastian Rudy in the area on 74 minutes.

BFF moves to appellate division

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) is going to start the KFC Independence Cup tomorrow after the clubs agreed to take part in the season's curtain-raising tournament without eight players whose fates will be decided by the full bench of the appellate division on Sunday.

The tournament is also set to start without Sheikh Jamal DC, who on Monday filed a writ petition demanding the return of those eight players --Mamunul Islam, Nasir Chowdhury, Raihan Hasan, Yeamin Ahmed Munna, Sohel Rana, Shahidul Alam Sohel, Jamal Bhuiyan and Alamgir Kabir Rana -- to the club. A high-court bench ruled in favour of the writ, directing the BFF not to allow those players to play for any teams except Sheikh Jamal and asked the BFF president and general secretary why their failure to return the players to Sheikh Jamal should not be declared illegal.

The BFF yesterday went to the chamber judge court to challenge Sheikh Jamal's writ on those eight players but the chamber judge court forwarded it to the full bench of appellate division for a hearing on Sunday.

The high court ruling forced BFF to defer the tournament that was supposed to start yesterday as the three clubs -- Chittagong Abahani, Sheikh Russel KC and Abahani -- who signed those players refused to take part without them but changed their minds yesterday.

"Sheikh Jamal have placed a letter that they will take part in the Independence Cup if their players are handed over and it is now a matter for the courts," said BFF gen-Shohag.

Messi nets 50th, Brazil salvage a draw

Lionel Messi scored his 50th international goal as Argentina notched their third straight victory in South America's 2018

World Cup qualifying tournament, while Brazil snatched a dramatic late draw against Paraguay on Tuesday.

Messi swept in an emphatic spot-kick after half an hour to help Argentina to a 2-0 win over Bolivia at the Estadio Mario Kempes in Cordoba, lifting the two-time world champions to third in the overall standings.

The Barcelona superstar's goalscoring exploits make him only the second player in Argentine history to reach a half century of

The 28-year-old striker is now closing in on legendary scorer Gabriel Batistuta's record of 56 goals, set between 1991 and 2002.

Messi now also needs only one more goal to reach 500 goals for club and country -raising the prospect that he could achieve that milestone with Barcelona this weekend when the Spanish giants take on Real Madrid in the Clasico.

Messi's Barcelona teammate Dani Alves was the hero of Brazil's 2-2 draw with bogey team Paraguay in Asuncion.

Paraguay looked to be on course for another famous victory to set alongside their Copa America wins over Brazil in 2011 and 2015 after taking a 2-0 lead early in the second half via goals from Dario Lezcano and Edgar Benitez.

But a Ricardo Oliveira goal on 79 minutes gave Brazil a lifeline as the clock ticked down. Deep into injury time, Chelsea forward Willian fed Alves and the fullback surged into the area to curl his shot beyond Paraguay goalkeeper Justo Villar.

defender David Luiz through suspension, might even have grabbed a late winner at the death but Villar saved an Alves shot.

It was the second straight game that Paraguay had conceded an injury-time equaliser after Ecuador's 2-2 draw last week.

Paraguay qualified for four consecutive World Cup tournaments between 1998 and 2010, where they reached the quarter-finals, but missed out in 2014.

Uruguay lead the standings with 13 points from six games after they followed up last Friday's 2-2 draw in Brazil with a 1-0 victory over Peru in Montevideo on Tuesday.
