Commuters suffer as major roads blocked for agitation by nurses, rally for Tonu, VVIP movement during opening of flyover

Around 2:15pm, the auto-rickshaw reached Dhanmondi, two blocks away from



RAIL THROUGH PADMA BRIDGE

Chinese company gets \$3.33b deal

Cabinet committee also appoints army as project consultant REJAUL KARIM BYRON

China will construct a rail route between Dhaka and Jessore through the Padma bridge, cutting travel time significantly and boosting national and regional connectivity.

The cabinet committee on economic affairs yesterday approved a proposal from

the railway ministry to give the job to China Railway Group Ltd.

The 215-kilometre rail network will link the capital for the first time with Jessore at a cost of \$3.33 billion. The new route will also directly connect Dhaka to Khulna, Benapole and Mongla.


