A Narayanganj court yesterday recorded testimony of witness Shahidul Islam, father-in-law of slain panel mayor Nazrul Islam, in two cases filed over sensational seven-murder.

District and Sessions Judge Syed Enayet Hossain started recording of the testimony around 10:30am, said Public Prosecutor Wazed Ali Khokon. Earlier in the morning,

law enforcers produced 23 charge-sheeted accused, including three sacked Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) officials, before the court amid tight security.

Air pollution overarching reason for pulmonary diseases

Experts tell seminar in capital while revealing findings of a research conducted by Bangladesh University

Nearly one fourth of the dwellers in the capital suffer from abnormal pulmonary function, for which high level of air pollution is an overarching reason, leading medical experts told a seminar yesterday.

Adolescent children, elderly people and pregnant women are much more susceptible to this menace, they said while revealing findings of a research

on effects of air pollution on public parts of the city. health, conducted by Bangladesh University (BU) over the last three months.

The university and Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC) jointly organised the seminar at the capital's Krishibid Institution.

The research was based on a random sample of 500 persons, aged from 10 to 40 and above, chosen from various slums and schools in different

Around 25 percent of the people tested were found to have abnormal lung function, said Prof Md Ruhul Amin, a paediatric pulmonologist at Dhaka Shishu Hospital.

Generally, exposure to high levels of air pollution causes bronchiolitis pneumonia, asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), said Amin, adding that such

ENVIRONMENT COURT

Laws need to be changed

Says Law Minister Anisul Hug

Laws should be changed for the environment court system's effective functioning, said Law Minister Anisul Huq yesterday, assuring to take up the issue to the environment and forests ministry, and the prime minister soon.

The environment is an evolving issue and so relevant laws should be changed from time to time, he said, adding that Bangladesh has been facing serious threats to the environment. He was addressing a workshop, "Functioning of

Environment Courts: The Regional Experience", organised by Bangladesh Environment Lawyers Association (Bela) in the capital's Brac Centre Inn. The first court was set up in 2000 during the Awami League's tenure, the law amended in 2010 a second tenure and now the current government will again make the court functional as it does not lack in political will on addressing environmental issues, he said.

Advocate Ritwick Dutta of the Indian Supreme Court said their "National Green Tribunal" (NGT) was independent and any aggrieved person or representative could file petitions, even if they think a development project might damage the environment. It comprises 10 judicial members and 10 environment experts with either a Supreme Court judge or a retired High Court chief justice as the chairperson.

Ritwick cited an instance when NGT cancelled an environment and forests ministry-approved 2,640MW coal-fired power plant project in Andhra Pradesh, for the larger interest of the nation from the point of view of ecology and the environment. Chairing the session, Bela Chief Executive Rizwana Hasan lamented that Bangladesh's environment court was not functioning properly despite being set up a decade SEE PAGE 5 COL 4

CORRUPTION CASE SC upholds bail for Mirza Abbas

The Supreme Court yesterday upheld a High Court verdict that granted bail to BNP leader Mirza Abbas in a corruption case, clearing the way for his release from jail.

A four-member bench of the Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice Surendra Kumar Sinha dismissed an appeal filed by Anti Corruption Commission against the HC verdict.

Abbas' lawyer Sagir Hossain Leon told The Daily Star that there was no legal bar to his client's release from the custody following the SC order.

Abbas was sent to jail on January 6 when he surrendered to the lower court in connection with the case.
