

very time Tonu's face surfaces on your Facebook newsfeed, a torrent of mixed feelings hit you at the same time -- outrage, sorrow, helplessness and so much more. Nothing to do but scroll on and eventually run away from the atrocity that we allowed and continue to allow on the streets of Bangladesh.

Sohagi Jahan Tonu, a young teenager who was obviously a dreamer like many a young man or woman in Bangladesh; most likely in love with the motherland, someone who enjoyed cricket, had high hopes for the national team, loved art and theatre and had many friends planning outings, movie nights and what to wear this year on Pahela Baishakh. Tonu was just another girl next door, who earned pocket money giving out private tuitions to children, maybe just a handful of years younger than herself. One fine day, as she goes about life, Tonu is raped, murdered and thrown by a culvert -- like kitchen or

a damaged tooth. Her unconscious body was found in the bordering area of Comilla cantonment by her father late at night, at around 11:00 pm.
