Siddikur, Sujjan take lead into final day

Bangladesh's ace golfer Siddikur Rahman and India's Sujjan Singh shared joint lead at the end of the third round of BTI Open, raising prospects of a

mouth-watering finish in today's fourth and final round.

Siddikur, a two-time Asian Tour winner, and Sujjan, a one-time Asian Development Tour winner, shared a two-stroke lead over the chasing pack, which features a number of prominent golfers from both Bangladesh and India.

The 31-year-old Siddikur, who had been going through a lean patch of form, showed signs of his old self as he produced a bogeyfree (66) in the third round at the Kurmitola Golf Club yesterday afternoon, after having wrapped up the second at two-under-par (70). The ace golfer fired a total of nine birdies over 24 holes on the third day and was looking forward to grabbing the fifth PGTI title of his career in front of his home crowd.

"I've not had a great first few months in 2016. I'll look to turn it around here with a good final round," Siddikur said at the end of day's play. "It'll be highly satisfying to win in

front of my home crowd once again. I have the advantage of local knowledge here but Sujjan [Singh] and Udayan [Mane] are also in good form and therefore would provide tough competition on the final day."

Sujjan, too, came out firing on all cylinders in the third round as he knocked down five birdies on the first 10 holes. He suffered a minor blip on the 13th where he dropped his only shot of the day. The 36-year-old, however, rallied with three consecutive birdies from the 15th through the 17th to end the round with a flourish.

"I didn't play too well at the Indian Open and as a result made a few changes in my swing. I feel those changes are now shaping up well and producing the desired results. I'll have to be at the top of my game to outscore Siddikur in the final round," said the Chandigarh lad.

Udayan Mane and Deepinder Singh Kullar (10-under-206) occupied the third and fourth places respectively while Bangladesh's Sajib Ali and Dulal Hossain, the overnight leaders, lay a further stroke behind at nine-under-par (207).

Earlier 57 players completed their second rounds in the morning session before the cut was declared at three-over-par (147), with 56 professionals and one amateur making it through.

Barcelona will honour legendary former player and coach Johan Cruyff as they look to inflict more misery upon eternal rivals Real Madrid in the Clasico on Saturday.

The most watched game in world football is Barca's first since Cruyff passed away at the age of 68 after a short battle with cancer last week.

A pre-match display involving over 90,000 fans will read "thank you Johan" with the same message carried on the Barca players' shirts. "In what is a special match, it is

without doubt extra motivation for us to try and win the game," said Barca

captain Andres Iniesta.

the occasion supersedes its importance in the title race in La Liga with Barca 10 points clear of third-placed Madrid with just eight games remaining.

A 4-0 thrashing of Real when the sides last met in November put Barca well on course to retain the title.

However, with Madrid now under new management since Zinedine Zidane replaced Rafael Benitez in January and with the front three of Cristiano Ronaldo, Gareth Bale and Karim Benzema fit and in scoring form, Iniesta expects a much tougher task on Saturday.

"These games are different, it doesn't matter how the teams are playing before because we all like to beat your biggest rivals," added the Spanish international.

"We expect a difficult, close game which will be decided by small details. We have all the respect in the world for Indeed, the emotion surrounding the team we will face because they win the game," said Messi.

tee chairman Ashraful Uddin Ahmed Chunnu. Sheikh Jamal will play their first match after Sunday's

Villa exclude Agbonlahor

Gabriel Agbonlahor has been omitted from Aston Villa's squad for Saturday's match at home to Chelsea as the Premier League's basement club look into the forward's conduct while on holiday.

The 29-year-old, a product of the Birmingham club's academy, has only made 15 Premier League appearances so far this season and his future at Villa Park now looks decidedly shaky.

On Friday, a Villa tweet

announced that Agbonlahor, pictured apparently smoking a shisha pipe during a recent holiday in Dubai, would not be involved in the Chelsea match while an internal investigation into his behaviour is carried out.

Caretaker manager Eric Black, in charge after Frenchman Remi Garde left on Tuesday, said: "There's an internal investigation. I spoke to (board member) David Bernstein at length (on Thursday) and the club have taken a decision. I have taken a decision on the footballing side to remove him from the squad, purely because I don't want anything to distract the players.

"I'll speak to him again on Monday and then we'll take it from there. He's back in and reporting for

training. "I'm not going to go into the details because the investigation is on going. I want us to get back to football and football alone."
