Family quizzed once again

No arrest; no headway in probe; students' strike today

With no arrest made and no one except the family members quizzed even in 13 days into the murder of Sohagi Jahan Tonu, her parents were once again interrogated by law enforcers yesterday.

The Criminal Investigation Department (CID), which took up the

murder probe on Tuesday, recorded the statements of Tonu's parents and three other members of the family at its office in Comilla. "We have just started the investigation. We are interrogat-

ing Tonu's parents to be clear about some matters," said Nazmul Karim Khan, special superintendent of CID's Comilla-Noakhali division.

"It is a continuous process. The CID officials will talk to them again, if needed, for the sake of investigation," he told The Daily Star over the phone.

A CID team brought Tonu's parents Yaar Hossain and Anwara Begum, elder brother Nazmul, younger brother Anwar, and a cousin-sister to its office from their residence around 3:00pm for the interrogation, said ASP of CID Mojammel Haq. In the morning, a joint CID team of Dhaka and Comilla

visited the crime scene in Comilla Moinamoti Cantonment and nearby areas, reports UNB.

Death toll rises to 31

Two more people, who suffered bullet injuries in violence centring on the second phase union parishad (UP) elections, died yesterday.

Iqbal Hossain, 28, and Hasan Howladar, 32, died at Dhaka Medical College Hospital in the morning.

With the two, the death toll in violence over the two phases of the UP polls rose to 31.

Iqbal, a Jubo League activist from Sheikhhati village in Jessore Sadar upazila, was shot during a clash between the supporters of the Awami League and the BNP in the village over elections to Noapara UP on March 28.

He was first admitted to a local hospital and taken to the DMCH in a critical condition a day later. He died there around 6:00am yesterday, said his family members.

Six transport leaders sued for cover-up bid

Nine transport workers and leaders have been sued over the "gang-rape" of a female garment worker in a moving bus in Tangail on Friday.

The husband of the victim, aged around 23, filed the case under the Women and Children Repression Prevention Act with Dhanbari Police Station later that night.

Mojibor Rahman, officer-in-charge of the police station, said three of the men were accused of gang-raping the woman while the other allegedly tried to protect the culprits.

Extremists getting nuke bomb is a real threat

Obama issues stark warning on nuclear terrorism, eyes to safeguard fissile materials

The threat from terrorists trying to launch a nuclear attack that would "change our world" is real, US President Barack Obama warned at a global summit in Washington on Friday.

Hoping to galvanize global action to prevent jihadists from getting hold of nuclear weapons or material for a "dirty bomb," Obama painted an apocalyptic picture of the impact of a nuclear terror attack.

The world has taken "concrete" steps to prevent nuclear terrorism, he told the Nuclear Security Summit. But the so-called Islamic

State (IS) obtaining a nuclear weapon is "one of the greatest threats to global security," he added.

Obama, who is leaves office next January, was hosting a fourth and likely final leaders' summit aimed at reducing the risk of a nuclear holocaust.

The first summit was held in Washington six years ago at Obama's behest, when the young president, fresh from winning the Nobel Peace Prize sketched out a vision of a world without nuclear weapons.

Today he stands as a president on his way out, trying to complete as much of his SEE PAGE 10 COL 5
