Three Shadows of Art

A solo art exhibition, of Md. Rashed Alam, titled Three Shadows of Art, has been inaugurated at Alliance Française de Dhaka's La Galerie. In his first solo exhibition, Md. Rashed Alam is presenting three types of artworks that he experimented on: dualism paintings, sculptures and miniatures.

Alam will also exhibit some of his miniatures which came out from

carving pencil leads, paintbrushes or even hand tools like hammer.
