AL to announce two Dhaka city unit committees

of the three-year tenure, at last the ruling Awami League is going to announce its Dhaka City Unit committee, splitting it into two, Dhaka north and south.

Syed Ashraful Islam, party general secretary, would declare the new committees today at a press conference at party president's Dhanmondi office at 11:00 am, said Mahbubul Alam Hanif, AL joint general secretary.

Sources said, Abul Hasnat, Lalbagh Thana unit president, and Shahey Alam Murad, city unit organising secretary, are going to be president and general secretary of Dhaka South AL, while City unit Vice-President and Dhaka-10 MP AKM Rahmatullah and Mohammadpur Thana President Sadek Khan are going to be president and general secretary of Dhaka North AL.

City AL held the last three-yearly council on December 27, 2012 and the tenure expired on December 26, 2015. That council did not see any voting, hence no new leaders.

In the last council, nearly 2,000 councillors and 3,000 delegates gathered to elect new leadership but it ended without any voting.

At the council, the city AL left the decision to pick new leaders with the party president Sheikh Hasina.

Till now the AL has one committee for Dhaka city and the city leaders, who were elected in 2003, are still at the helm.

The city unit's December 2012 council took place nine years after the previous one, held on June 18, 2003, where Mohammad Hanif was made president and Maya general secretary. After Hanif's demise on November 28, 2006, MA Aziz was made acting president. Aziz died on January 23 this year.

There are 26 thana, 103 ward and 17 union units under Dhaka city. The city AL held councils at all units except two -- Jatrabari and Demra thanas -- but announced full committees only in four--Dhanmondi, Hazaribagh, New Market

and Kalabagan. After the Dhaka city corporation elections in April last year, Hasina gave SEE PAGE 10 COL 1 responsibilities should be well-defined.

Focus on prevention

Speakers tell policy dialogue on improving urban health organised by PPRC in capital

The local government ought to put emphasis on preventive measures to improve urban health rather than providing direct treatment, speakers told a policy dialogue yesterday.

Preventive measures include providing sanitation and safe drinking water, facilitating open space for physical exercise, controlling mosquito, maintaining proper sewerage system, stopping food adulteration, and waste management, they said at the dialogue styled "How can City Government Improve Urban Health?" in the capital's Local Government Engineering Department's auditorium.

Power and Participation Research Centre (PPRC) organised the dialogue in association with Municipal Association of Bangladesh (MAB), supported by WaterAid, with PPRC Executive Chairman Hossain Zillur Rahman in the chair.

"... city corporations and municipalities should come up with innovative initiatives for providing public health service with participation of residents, " said Rahman. There are ambiguities between the local

government and health ministries in shar-

ing responsibilities and providing primary

health services, he said, adding that the

Emphasising decentralisation of health service, Dr Zafrullah Chowdhury, founder of Gonoshasthaya Kendra, said centralised treatment services could not help ensuring improved treatment.

Proper sanitation and safe water supply could prevent many diseases in the country, he added.

"There are many responsibilities within the purview of municipalities under the Local Government (municipality) Act-2009 for providing health service, but no allocation is being made to facilitate it," said Dr Bushra Alam, senior health specialist of World Bank in Dhaka, urging the respective mayors and councillors to raise a united voice for allocating budget to health facilities under the municipalities.

Citing the Urban Health Survey-2013, AMM Nasir Uddin, senior fellow at the PPRC, said 75 percent of urban poor families were living in a single room, 65 percent sharing water sources with 10 or more households, 85 percent using shared latrines, 50 percent dumping garbage in open spaces, while only 13 percent of households have access to improved sanitation.

Dr Md Khairul Islam, country representative of WaterAid Bangladesh, also spoke at the event attended by municipal mayors, councillors and health service providers.

FROM PAGE 4 mobility, creation of employment opportunities, and strengthening of human rights and the rule of law, and fostering of children with a tolerant and scientific outlook in aspi-

ration to build a knowledge-based society.

Shahriar also underlined Bangladesh's partnership with the Global Community Engagement and Resilience Fund (GCERF) to further work through community-based organisations.

He expressed commitments to continue to remain a reliable partner of the UN in fighting terrorism and preventing violent extremism globally, regionally and nationally.

On the sidelines of the conference, he had a bilateral meeting with Baroness Anelay of St John's, minister of state of the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, UK, to discuss on further strengthening the areas of mutual cooperation, including in the field of preventing radicalisation and violent

extremism in respective societies through information and experience sharing and technical cooperation.

The British state minister expressed the UK's willingness to cooperate with and support Bangladesh in this regard.

Shahriar also requested his British counterpart to look into the issue of the ongoing difficulties being faced by Bangladeshi citizens in obtaining British visas. Earlier, Shahriar held a meeting with Baroness Patricia Scotland, the newly appointed secretary-general of the Commonwealth.

The Commonwealth secretary general briefed Shahriar about the Commonwealth's future plans in the field of preventing violent extremism, including the idea of more intense cooperation between the judiciaries among the Commonwealth countries.

Shahriar also attended a ministerial lunch hosted by the UN secretary-general and Swiss foreign minister on Friday.
