Traffic police, experts oppose ministry's move to allow 5,000 autos on clogged city roads

Instead of introducing more buses, the government is moving to allow 5,000 more CNG-run auto-rickshaws on Dhaka streets, which has the potential to worsen the perennial congestion.

"A decision was made in principle to give 5,000 licenses against the withdrawal of as many three-wheeler mishuks from the city streets last year, which deteriorated the transport crisis," said a senior official of the road transport and bridges ministry, seeking anonymity.

Father saw head injury, inquest found none

saw it too.'


Besides, he noticed that blood had come out from Tonu's nose and ears. This too is missing in the inquest report.

No load shedding despite heat wave

Even a couple of years ago, it was unimaginable to think of a sultry April day without power outages. As the mercury peaks up

with the pre-summer heat from March, the time when ponds almost dry up and rivers run narrow, farmers across the country turn to use electricity heavily for irrigation. This has been invariably triggering load shedding during March to May for the last two decades.

However, this year's story is different: there is no load shedding.

According to the Power Development Board (PDB), power supply now stands at a historic high. It is now supplying around 8,300 megawatt of power -- a sharp 800MW jump from last year's corresponding period. And if this figure is compared to that of 2009, one will be impressed. Back then the country could avail just around 3,500MW

"Power supply situation is so far so good," said a power board official. "We still cannot generate around 1,000MW power SEE PAGE 10 COL 2
