



MOHENJO DARO to release on August 12

Actor Hrithik Roshan's much awaited film "Mohenjo Daro" will hit the screens on August 12. The 42-year-old "Bang Bang" star took to Twitter to announce the release date as well as wrap on the Ashutosh Gowariker-directed project. "Journeys that test strength of character are ones you should be most PROUD OF! It's a WRAP! #MohenjoDaro @hegdepooja," Hrithik tweeted. The actor also shared a picture of him-

self holding a clap board flashing the release date with the "Lagaan" filmmaker in the background. Also starring in the venture are debutant Pooja Hegde and veteran actor Kabir Bedi. The movie is an epic adventure-romance set in the ancient city of Mohenjo-daro, Sindh, Pakistan in the era of the Indus Valley civilisation that dates back to 2600BC. The movie marks Gowariker's second collaboration with Hrithik after the 2008 film "Jodhaa Akbar".



Marvel superheroes to join 'Spider-Man' reboot

The upcoming "Spider-Man" reboot, starring Tom Holland as the superhero, will include cameos from other Marvel superheroes. Marvel Studios president Kevin Feige confirmed the news, saying: "He (Spider-Man) is in the universe now, and the fun of the universe is that characters go back and forth."

Sony Pictures Entertainment has teamed with Marvel Studios to produce the sixth movie in its franchise. Jon Watts is directing the currently untitled "Spider-

Man" film, which focuses on a teenage Parker's high school days. Marisa Tomei will star as Aunt May, and Zendaya will also be a part of the film, which is set for release July 7, 2017.

Holland will debut his Spider-Man in "Captain America: Civil War". A recent trailer shows Iron Man calling upon Spider-Man to use his web shooters against Captain America, implying that Holland's character is on Team Iron Man in the film.

taps police brutality victims for music video

Singer Beyonce Knowles, who earlier faced a backlash over her controversial song "Formation" and its politically-charged performance at the Super Bowl 50, is now said to be readying a new music video that will centre on the families of teens who were killed by the police.

Over the weekend, Knowles's reputable fan site The Beyhive revealed that one of her upcoming visuals would feature the parents of victims who will

reportedly appear in the video holding photographs of their slain sons. Their tragic deaths helped spark the "Black Lives Matter" movement.

Details about the video or which song it is for are still unknown. However, her fans believe the track is part of the singer's new album that is expected to be released sometime next month before she begins her "Formation" world tour on April 27.
