Gazipur city mayor sent to jail in bus torching case

Gazipur City Corporation Mayor Prof MA Mannan and nine others were sent to jail yesterday noon, following an order of senior Judicial Magistrate Mohammad Iqbal Masud. They were arrested on Friday night over torching a bus in Chandona Chowrasta of Gazipur city the same day. Sub-inspector Ahadul Islam of Joydebpur police filed a case naming 40 people including MA Mannan and accusing 30 other unknown people, of them, 11 are BNP-backed ward councillors of Gazipur City Corporation. According to the prosecution, Mannan held a meeting with 150 leaders at his Salna residence the same day, planning subversive activities. The nine arrestees are Mannan's brother Abdul Qadir, former BNP secretary general of Kaultia Union Abdul Khaliq Dealer, Rofiz Uddin, Shahin Alam, Habibullah, SM Akram, Sabdula Ali, Alam, and car driver Mizanur Rahman.

UNION PARISHAD ELECTIONS 2016

Violence kills two more, injures ten

At least two persons were killed and 10 others injured in clashes in the last two days, raising the death toll in violence over union parishad (UP) polls to 35. The killings took place in post-polls violence in Pirojpur and Jessore and the injuries in pre-poll violence in Bogra, reports correspondents. Elections to 1,364 UPs were held in the first two phases on March 22 and March 31, polls to 621 UPs are scheduled to be held on April 23 in the third phase, to 743 UPs on May 7 in the fourth and around 1,400 more UPs in two other phases till June. Violence has been continuing in different districts since announcement of the first phase of the UP polls schedule on February 11, leaving over 1,000 people injured. In Pirojpur, a youth was killed in an attack allegedly by supporters of newly elected Nesarabad upazila's Jalabari UP Chairman Ashis Kumar Boral yesterday morning, reports our correspondent. Jasimuddin Palash, 35, son of Amir

Hossain Howlader of Durgakathi village under the upazila's Samudoykathi union, was taken to a shop on Palash at Purbo Jalabari village around 11:00am, alleged the victim's family members. The supporters attacked and beat him mercilessly with iron rods and left him dead, alleged Palash's younger brother Shimul Howlader. Palash came under attack as he was a supporter of a defeated chairman aspirant, Shimul told journalists. Ashis could not be contacted over the phone for comment. Nesarabad Police Station Officer-in-Charge (OC) Monirul Islam told The Daily Star that the incident might have been connected to previous enmity and police were conducting investigations. In Jessore, a youth died following scuffles at a reception the local Awami League (AL) organised for the newly elected Monirampur upazila's Moshmimnagar UP chairman on Friday night. Raju Ahmed was brought out injured following the scuffles at the programme at Noali Boro Mosque

area, said Monirampur Police Station OC Taherul Islam. He was taken to a local hospital and, as his condition deteriorated, was referred to another hospital and died on the way, reports a correspondent. Raju's political affiliation could not be known. In Bogra, at least 10 persons were injured in a clash between supporters of two chairman aspirants of Bhatra UP under Nandigram upazila on Friday night. The clash erupted when independent candidate Tirtha Shailil and his supporters came under attack by supporters of AL-nominated candidate Morshedul Bari at Podditpukur area around 7:00pm on Friday, said police and locals. Talking to The Daily Star, Bari denied the allegation. Elections to the Bhatra UP will be held on May 7. In Chittagong, a case was filed with Kotwali Police Station accusing around 300 to 350 unknown persons for vandalising an AL office on Friday following feuds over selecting chairman candidates of around nine UPs under Anwara upazila, reports our correspondent.

RAJSHAHI CITY Many high-rises disregarding safety

Many of the privately-owned multi-story buildings, under construction in Rajshahi metropolis, are not properly following the safety rules, causing dangers to pedestrians and construction workers. According to the officials of Rajshahi Development Authority (RDA), the buildings should have canopies around them to prevent the fall of masonry that may lead to injuries and deaths. At the same time, many buildings are being constructed at busy intersections and important points like markets and mosques in the city, which adds to the risk of accidents. A few months ago, a construction worker named Abul Akhter Babu, 24, was killed when a portion of an under-construction three-story building collapsed on him in Tikapara area. Another worker, Mobarak, 55, died in October last year, falling off a six-story building being constructed in Kadirganj. Ashraful Haque, chief engineer of Rajshahi City Corporation, said it was mandatory for everyone to follow the safety guidelines in public interest. He said the construction of high-rises was a recent phenomenon in Rajshahi; that's why owners should be forced to follow rules strictly.
