

As a member of censor board, do you think our film industry has better days ahead?


Suborna Mustafa: I believe that it is possible to make a good film, but for that new directors will have to come forward with new

Also, if we can give congenial atmosphere for the cine-goers, they will go to theatres. The number of cinema halls will also have to increase.

Is there anything significant outside of acting that you're doing these days? Suborna Mustafa: I do cricket commentary now, which I really enjoy a lot.

Eastern Bank Limited and Chalacchitram are assisting in the programme.


Dilip Kumar in hospital

India watches with concern

Film lovers in India are keeping close tabs on 93-year-old legendary actor Dilip Kumar ever since he was hospitalised at Lilavati Hospital in Mumbai. The thespian was admitted to hospital after he complained of respiratory problems. Doctors were also concerned about his high fever, pneumonia and infection.

The film world has rallied behind the actor. Social media are trending a new image of the star. The photograph shows Kumar resting in bed as his wife Saira Banu looks into the camera with concern



for her husband clearly written on her face.

Amitabh Bachchan' tweeted "Spoke to Saira ji on sms .. Dilip saheb is doing well .. and we all pray for his speedy recovery

An update by Saira Banu on Kumar's Twitter account says that the actor is recovering well and will be discharged soon.

Called the 'tragedy king of Bollywood' for his many roles as a doomed lover, Kumar featured in Kranti, Shakti, Karma and Saudagar. His last film was Qila in 1998. Kumar was awarded Padma Vibhushan in 2015. Earlier, he was honoured with Padma Bhushan in 1991 and the Dadasaheb Phalke Award in 1994 for his outstanding contribution to Indian cinema.

AXLROSE TO JOIN AC/DC ON TOUR



Australian rock band AC/DC have announced Axl Rose, the lead singer of Guns N' Roses, will step in as front-man to complete the band's latest tour, after AC/DC singer Brian Johnson stepped aside due to hearing loss.

Johnson, 68, who joined the band in 1980 after Bon Scott, the original lead singer, died after a heavy night's drinking, was advised in March to "stop touring immediately or risk total hearing loss."

AC/DC was halfway through a US tour with 10 remaining shows, with another 12 shows planned for Europe in May and June.

AC/DC said in a statement on Sunday that Rose had "kindly offered his support" to help the band meet its touring commitments. Rose, 54, will join the band for its first European show in Lisbon on May 7.

The US tour dates will be announced "imminently", the band said, and will also feature Rose.

The band thanked Johnson "for his contribu-


tions and dedication to the band throughout the years" and wished him luck with his "future ventures".

Johnson has been quiet since the news was announced but close friend Jim Breuer, a comedian, said last month the rock star felt "kicked to the kerb" by the band.

Guns N' Roses reunited for the first time in two decades to play the Coachella festival in California this weekend. Rose will still play the band's scheduled tour dates over the next months.

AC/DC parted ways with its drummer Phil Rudd in July last year, after he was convicted of threatening to kill and possession of drugs. Rhythm guitarist Malcolm Young also stepped aside in September 2014 after announcing he had dementia. The band has sold more than 200 million records worldwide since it formed in 1973. Guns N' Roses, formed in 1985, have sold about 100 million.


