Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said her government is making constant strides to reach the immigration and passport services to the doorstep of the people.

In this regard, she said the government is working to make the country's immigration and passport procedure completely modern through introducing safe travel documents including electronic passport.

She said this while inaugurating "Passport Seba Saptaha-2016" and new buildings of 10 divisional and regional passport and visa offices at a function at the Department of Immigration and Passport (DIP) office in the capital.

The newly inaugurated passport offices are -- Dhaka Divisional Passport and Visa office and regional passport offices in Kishoregonj, Manikganj, Brahmanbaria, Patuakhali, Feni, Munshiganj, Kushtia, Pabna and Dinajpur. The Passport Seba Saptaha will be observed till April 28 with the slogan "Passport Nagorik Odhikar: Niswartha

Sebai Ongikar". Pointing out her government's steps for development of the immigration and passport sector, Hasina said people

usually go abroad in a large number from the districts. She said so far 1.4 crore machine readable passports and 3.26 lakh machine readable visas were issued by the DIP. Earlier, Hasina inaugurated newly built academic building of Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Adarsha Mahila College.

PM opens 10 new Foreign missions, cross section condemn RU prof murder

Foreign missions in Dhaka and crosssection of people yesterday stoutly condemned the heinous murder of AFM Rezaul Karim Siddiquee, professor of English at Rajshahi University, who was found with his throat slit in Shalbagan area in Rajshahi city on Sunday.

They also called for quick probe and bringing the perpetrators to book.

US Ambassador to Bangladesh Marcia Stephens Bloom Bernicat said in a statement, "We urge the government of Bangladesh to condemn these murders and apprehend the perpetrators behind this and other attacks motivated by intolerance and hatred."

Mentioning that the initial findings indicate the murder was committed by fanatics, EU Ambassador Pierre Mayaudon said "Should it be confirmed, this would be yet another terror attack in

Bangladesh in a short period of time." "This murder is a direct attack on

intelligence, culture and spirit of

generosity, which were what Professor Karim was representing," said French Ambassador Sophie Aubert. The foreign envoys conveyed their

condolences to the bereaved family. Educational institutions, teachers' organisations, students' bodies con-

demned the murder too. Teachers' associations at Dhaka University issued a statement saying that the militant outfits were ruthlessly continuing their killing mission since similar murders in the past went

unpunished while the teachers of

Jagannath University held a human chain and a rally on the campus. Teachers and students of Jatiya Kabi Kazi Nazrul Islam University, Shahjalal University of Science and Technology and Barisal University held human

chains and rallies on their respective campuses, protesting the attack. Those involved in such killings would continue their atrocities since the government in the past attempted

to avoid its responsibilities..., claimed

a statement of Ain o Salish Kendra. Moreover, a joint statement signed

by 22 eminent citizens called upon the people of the country to raise voice against murderers and their heinous activities.

BSS reports; Lambasting the murder, Bangladesh University Grants Commission Chairman Prof Abdul Mannan said, "Through the killing of Dr Siddiquee, it is evident that a group of people with strong political links has become desperate to damage the image of the country."

Meanwhile, BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said, "The process to get justice has been eliminated. As a result, such incidents are increasing alarmingly."

Many organisations including Samprodayikota-Jongibad Birodhi Mancha issued separate statements condemning the recent murders including of Siddiquee.

They also criticise the prevailing culture of impunity in this regard.

Matia places EPZ labour bill in JS

Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury yesterday placed two separate bills titled "Bangladesh Investment Development Authority Bill" and "Bangladesh EPZ Labour Bill" in parliament. The investment bill was aimed at setting up a new

authority by merging together the Board of Investment (BoI) and the Privatisation Commission for encouraging local and foreign investments in the private sector. The bill was sent to the parliamentary standing commit-

tee on law, justice and parliamentary for scrutiny and sending back to the House within next 10 working days.

According to the bill, there will be a Bangladesh Investment Development Authority with its main office in Dhaka.

There will be a 17-member governing board headed by the prime minister, while its executive chairman will act as the member secretary.

The EPZ labour bill was also sent to the same parliamentary committee for scrutiny and sending back to the House within 15 working days.
