Impress Telefilm and Touquir Ahmed's film "Oggyatonama" will premiere at the Marché du Film section of the Festival de Cannes

2016. The film will be screened at Palais I of the Palais des Festivals on May 17 at 6pm.

Impress Telefilm's managing director Faridur Reza Sagor and director Towquir Ahmed will travel to Cannes for the screening.

"Oggyatonama" is the first Bangladeshi film to premiere at the Marché du Film, a commercial platform for directors and producers from around the world to screen their films.

Coordinator of Nrityanchal Muhammad Jahangir and director duo -Shibly Mohammad and Shameem Ara Nipa spoke at the press meet.

Legendary Bharatanatyam dancer Leela Samson will inaugurate the festival as chief guest while Mustafa Manwar, noted cultural personality, will attend the event as special guest. The organisers will also honour Nrityaguru Rahija Khanam Jhunu at the

programme. Directed by Shibly Mohammad, about 250 artistes of Nrityanchal will perform in a Kathak Nritya Sandhya at 7pm on April 27 at NTH of BSA. Nrityanchal, joining hands with Srishti Cultural Centre, will present dance-drama "Badi Bandar Roopkatha"


Final episode of Ujan Ganger Naiya on ATN Bangla

releases visual album "Lemonade"

Beyonce's latest effort, "Lemonade the Visual Album", has arrived.

"Lemonade" is the megastar's sixth studio album, following the self-titled set she released without warning in December 2013. It dropped on Saturday night (Sunday morning Bangladesh time) alongside the singer's HBO special of the same name.

Like albums from her fellow Tidal artist coowners recently -- Rihanna's "ANTI" and Kanye West's "The Life of Pablo" --Beyonce's new project was initially released exclusively on the subscription streaming service.

Beyonce released the new song "Formation" on February 6 and the next day announced a 40-date headlining stadium tour set to begin April 27.

The list of collaborators and contributors for the album is, to say the least, extensive, with the credits for the album bubbling north of 3,000 words. An abridged rundown of those involved includes: Kendrick Lamar, The Weeknd, Diplo, James Blake, Just Blaze, Mike Dean, while samples include Led Zeppelin's "When The Levee Breaks", Burt Bacharach's "Walk On By" and OutKast's

"SpottieOttieDopalicious", among others.



Although Madhuri Dixit-Nene already has a film named after her - 2003's "Main Madhuri Dixit Banna Chahti Hoon!" ("I Want to be Madhuri Dixit!"), she feels a biopic on her can wait. "There are so many things I want to do. There is still time for that," she told Hindustan Times.

As the leading ladies of Bollywood - Priyanka Chopra and Deepika Padukone - make their foray into Hollywood, Madhuri says she doesn't regret not getting a similar opportunity. The actor, who has been acting for more than three decades, is happy with how her career has shaped up. "It's wonderful to see our girls going there and doing such a wonderful job like Priyanka, Deepika or Aishwarya. But there

are no regrets. People are curious about our culture. I wish they continue to include this in films," she says.

Talking about the new heroines, Madhuri says that there is nothing that she can teach them as they are already doing a fabulous job. "I think these girls are smart and it's wonderful to see that they are so prepared. They are bright and so aware of everything that is going on. I don't think there is any advice. I enjoy watching them and their performances," she says.

"All of them are so good... Alia Bhatt, Shraddha Kapoor...then there is Deepika, Priyanka, Kareena... all of them are doing such a great job," she added.
