Sensing the robbers' presence, locals, who were guarding the area, chased them. When the news spread, locals surrounded the whole area and caught three of the criminals and beat them up, killing the trio on the spot.

Local ward councillor Nichhar Uddin Ahmed said locals had earlier foiled several robbery attempts. At the police administration's suggestion, locals divided into several teams and started guarding the area at night as incidents of robbery increased recently, said the councillor.

On April 19, a restaurant in the area was robbed, said locals. When asked, detained Rubel said four other detainees and he worked as labourers at a fish market at Karnaphuli ghat.

He along with the four went to Beribandh area as Sagar and Russell, who were also labourers at Karnaphuli ghat, asked them to meet there, said Rubel.

After they reached the spot, they saw some unknown people there, he added.

Sagar then told them that they were going to rob a house, he added. The bodies of the deceased were sent to Chittagong Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsies.

The five detainees were kept in police custody for interrogation, said police.

certainly doesn't matter whether you pray to a god or you don't. You don't deserve to be killed. It's murder. It's wrong and it needs to stop," she said in an emotion-choked voice, referring to the killing of her former protocol assistant Xulhaz.

"There is an environment here where people think they can get away with it," she said, terming the murder of Xulhaz and Tonoy a barbaric act.

Bernicat made the remarks after meeting Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal at the Secretariat.

Asked about the US envoy's comment that killers are getting away with murders, Kamal said, "It was an emotional statement [from Bernicat] and it has no basis."

Police are doing their job, risking their lives. "Such types of killings are being committed across the globe," he said.

Though it was a prescheduled courtesy call, the killing of Xulhaz and Tonoy and Saturday's murder of Rajshahi University teacher Rezaul Karim Siddiquee topped the agenda at the meeting.

In the wake of the recent killings, both of them stressed the need for fighting terrorism together.

About Xulhaz, the envoy said, "He was a beloved employee, he was a cherished colleague."

She said US Secretary of State John Kerry called her on Tuesday to "offer his personal condolences to both Xulhaz's embassy family and his Bangladeshi family".

Referring to the recent murder of a Bangladeshi couple in San Jose, California, she said the perpetrators would be brought to justice as her country hates crime and doesn't support any act of violence.

"I just met with your home minister, with the heads of your police forces. They are our strong partners. But they can't do this job alone, none of us can. We all have to do it together."

Replying to a question, she said, "We are working very hard on all of our counter-terrorism cooperation and I can assure you that my government wants to help Bangladesh."

After the 90-minute meeting, Kamal told reporters that his ministry is going to set up a 24/7 anti-terrorism cell to monitor all information related to terrorism and pass that on to relevant law enforcement agencies as part of efforts to curb terrorism.

The additional secretary (political) would lead the cell and play the role of the coordinator among all wings of law enforcement agencies.

He urged the US ambassador to share with the Bangladesh authorities all the information they have.

Kamal reiterated that there is no base of Islamic State (IS) in Bangladesh and those who claimed the responsibility for the murders under the names of different organisations, such as Ansar Al Islam, are all the same, and all of them are home-grown terrorists.

The minister said progress has been made in 31 such sensitive cases and those involved in the recent murders would be brought to book.

He said the US envoy appreciated the progress and development Bangladesh's police have made of late.

'Employee' found dead at Apple HQ

An Apple Inc employee was found dead in a conference room at the company's headquarters in northern California in what police called an isolated incident, local media reported yesterday.

Police responded to an emergency call from Apple's campus in Cupertino at about 8:35am local time about a man with a head wound, the San Jose Mercury News reported.

Archived dispatch audio reported that the unidentified victim was found in a conference room with a gun, according to the paper.

Sergeant Andrea Urena of the Santa Clara County Sheriff's Office called the death an "isolated incident" and said no suspects were being sought, the Mercury News reported.

Apple did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

Rahman, acting editor of Bangla daily Amar Desh, who was also shown arrested in the case filed over the alleged conspiracy, the IO said.

Therefore, Shafik needs to be kept in jail until the investigation completes, he added.

Earlier on April 25, another Dhaka court placed Mahmudur Rahman on five-day remand in the case.

Plainclothes detectives arrested Shafik at his Eskaton Road residence in the capital on April 16. He was remanded for five days on the same day.

Three days late, police claimed that Shafik admitted to meeting four people, including the three convicted by a US court in March last year for bribing an FBI special agent for confidential information. The three are US-Bangladesh citizen Rizve Ahmed Caesar, former FBI special agent Robert Lustyik and his "contact" Johannes Thaler.

Caesar was convicted for bribing an FBI special agent to collect information about a Bangladeshi political figure. The US Justice Department did not name the figure, but it is believed to be Joy.

According to the case statement, Caesar's father Mohammad Ullah Mamun, vice-president of the BNP's cultural wing Jasas, and some top leaders of the BNP and its allies met in the UK, US and many places in Bangladesh before September 2012 and conspired to abduct and kill the PM's son who lives in the US.

In a Facebook post on March 9 last year, Joy, information and communication technology affairs adviser to the PM, accused BNP leaders of conspiring to abduct and kill him.

Shafik, who also holds British citizenship, worked in several media outlets, including the BBC, but came in the limelight after becoming editor of the weekly Jaijaidin in the 1980s.

Bring culprits to book

"It is also essential to ensure the protection and safety of all citizens," a spokesperson for the EU said.

"Thorough investigations into these killings need to take place to ensure those responsible are brought to justice."

EU spokesperson from Brussels said two Bangladeshi LGBTI (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex) activists had brutally been murdered in an attack in Dhaka, which also left a policeman and a security guard injured.

With the killings of a law student (Nazim Uddin Samad) on April 6 and an English professor (Prof Rezaul) on April 23, this is already the third violent attack in Bangladesh in less than a month, the EU statement read.

France, in a statement from Paris, said, "These outrageous killings come in addition to a series of murders, most of them claimed by Daech [IS], occurring in Bangladesh these last months against civil society members, rights defenders and representatives of religious minorities."

"The culprits must be brought to justice."

France condemned the murders of Prof Rezaul, Hindu priest Paramananda Roy and the two LGBT rights defenders, Xulhaz and Tonoy.

Australia said it wanted to see swift investigations into the murders.

"We trust these acts will be investigated swiftly and that those responsible will face justice," Australian High Commissioner in Dhaka Greg Wilcock said in a statement yesterday.

He also said the victims were respected citizens. "We offer our condolences to their families, friends and communities."

The Embassy of Switzerland in Bangladesh in a statement said the recent killings constituted a "serious threat" to the freedom of expression and were grave violations of basic human rights.

It said the freedom of expression was deeply rooted in Bangladesh's long-traced tradition of tolerance, harmony and respect for human rights -- the principles on which the country was built.

The United Nations has also expressed concern over the recent murders in Bangladesh.

It called for addressing the crimes through effective and prompt investigations by law enforcement agencies.

"The UN is concerned that intolerance-related violence is increasing in Bangladesh -- just two days ago we heard about the killing of Professor Rezaul Karim Siddiquee of the University of Rajshahi. In another recent incident, two activists were killed," Stéphane Dujarric, spokesperson for the UN secretary-general, said at a briefing at the UN headquarters on Tuesday.

Earlier, the US, the UK, Germany, Norway, Denmark and the UN in Bangladesh expressed concern over the rise in murders and violent attacks in

Bangladesh. They also called for effective and speedy investigations into the incidents to bring the perpetrators to justice.

Xulhaz, 42, and his friend Tonoy, 25, were murdered at a flat in capital's Kalabagan on Monday while Prof Rezaul and Paramananda were killed in Rajshahi and Gopalganj on April 23. Jagannath University law student Nazim Uddin Samad, a Gonojagoron Mancha activist, was killed in Dhaka on April 6.

party's co-chairman in a bid to tighten his control on the party.

Aggrieved by Ershad's "unilateral decisions", a group of JP leaders, led by presidium member Ziauddin Ahmed Bablu, on the same day revolted against the party chief. To put pressure on Ershad, they declared Raushan the party's acting chairman, JP insiders said.

Since then, the Bablu-led group had been opposing Quader's appointment and was trying to make Raushan the party's senior co-chair to reduce Ershad's authority in the party, they added.

While formally giving new charge to his brother Quader, Ershad on January 20 had said he appointed Quader the party's co-chairman as his wife and he have become too old to run the party.

"I have taken opinions of the people of Rangpur, the stronghold of the party, and appointed GM Quader the co-chairman after taking the opinions into consideration," he had said.

On the same day, Ershad also removed Bablu, also secretary general of the party.

Ershad replaced Bablu with his loyalist Ruhul Amin Hawlader, who was JP secretary general for 12 years since 2002. Hawlader lost the post to Bablu in mid-2014.

Ershad had said he made the changes in the party's top leadership to restore confidence among its leaders and activists.

through an unlocked sliding glass door when they hadn't heard from the Rabbi's for days.

A source told ABC7 News off-camera they found a gruesome scene as their bodies were found on the hardwood floor along with a message written in ink reading: "Sorry, my first kill was clumsy."

Police have not commented on the existence of the note, but local broadcaster ABC7 was told about it by one of the people who discovered the couple.

"Both victims were shot at least once," San Jose Police Department said in a statement.

The Rabbi's lived close to the mosque and were devoted members.

Friends said fortunately, the couple's sons were not at home during the murders.

President Nicolas Maduro had already given most of Venezuela's 2.8 million state employees Fridays off during April and May, to cut down on electricity consumption.

He said Venezuela had been badly hit by the El Nino weather phenomenon and would return to normal when it started raining again.

"We are requesting international help, technical and financial aid to help revert the situation," he said. "We are managing the situation in the best possible way while we wait for the rains to return."

"Several countries in the region have been affected by the drought, caused by El Nino. But Venezuela has the highest domestic consumption of energy."

The government has already adopted a number of other measures to try to deal with the crisis. In February, shopping centres were told to reduce their opening hours and generate their own energy.

Last week, the government said it would consider putting the clocks forward by half an hour to reduce demand for electricity in the early evening. It also announced it was introducing power cuts for four hours a day.

The power shortages have deepened the country's serious economic crisis. Many businessmen and opposition politicians blame the energy crisis and shortages of basic goods on government economic mismanagement.

They say tough currency controls introduced in 2003 by the late president, Hugo Chavez, have only made this worse.

But Venezuela's economy has also been hit by a sharp fall in the price of its main export, oil.

After a few months, Ibrahim noticed that guardians from other villages, like Gangopara and Telipukur, some 2 or 2.5km from Dargamaria, brought their children to the school.

"Finally, I got 10 regular students, mostly primary and high school students from other villages," he said.

Asked whether there was any objection against the school, Ibrahim said he did not hear of any.

Village women used to visit the school to listen to the music. Usually, the kids were taught Chhoragan, and Tagore and Nazrul songs there, he said.

Ibrahim said Prof Rezaul asked him to practise Chhoragan and Sargam more than any other songs. Noorjahan, a student of the music school, told this correspondent that she along with her younger sister Nargis and eight others of Gangopara village were very happy to go to the music school.

"I learnt a few songs there. But now I don't know what will happen if the school is closed," she said.

Noorjahan is also a class-VIII student of Karnapara High School.

Shahjahan Ali, a TV-radio mechanic, said, "Mukul bhai [nick name of Prof Rezaul] wanted to help the children explore and develop their skills in music and tried to bring in all the music lovers in and around the village there."

"Mukul bhai and I used to sit in the school together, and he played his sitar and I played the harmonium," he said.

"Now that Mukul bhai is gone, the school will have to be closed and there will be no entertainment for us."

No 'shortcut' to new S Africa president

Says defiant Zuma

Embattled South African President Jacob Zuma yesterday appeared to rule out resigning before his second term ends in 2019, as protesters used the anniversary of the country's first democratic polls to renew calls for him to quit.

"If you're elected at one point, and people no longer want you, humble yourself, accept it," Zuma told thousands of supporters at a rally in northern Limpopo province to mark the 22nd anniversary of the election that brought anti-apartheid icon Nelson Mandela to power.

But Zuma also warned there could be no "shortcuts" to a shake-up at the top, saying any change of government had to come through "democratic institutions, so that we can have a peaceful state where the will of the majority prevails."

At a press briefing in his office yesterday, Mohammad Asaduzzaman, superintendent of police in Bogra, said acting on a tip-off that some men of the banned militant organisation were holding a secret meeting at the house of Momin in Kamarpara, a police team raided there around 3:00am.

The team then arrested Momin along with an AK-22 rifle, a foreign pistol, four magazines and 52 bullets. Other JMB men managed to flee.

During interrogation, Momin confessed to police that the rifle was used in the Shia mosque attack, the police official claimed.

Momin also said JMB men used to come to his house before the attack. But he did not admit his involvement in the attack or disclose the source of the arms, the SP said.

Additional Superintendent of police in Bogra Arifur Rahman Mondal, who led the drive, said Momin was produced before a court here with a 10-day remand prayer.

The court placed him on a seven-day remand, Arif added.

On November 26, 2015, a gang of JMB men stormed the Shia mosque in Haripur village in Shibganj and opened fire on praying people, killing Mozammam Hossain, 70, muezzin of the mosque, and injuring three others.

Hearing screams, locals rushed there and took Mizanur to Bheramara Upazila Health Complex. He was later shifted to Kushtia General Hospital. As his condition deteriorated, Mizanur was taken to the Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.

Minarul Islam, another brother of the victims who narrowly escaped the attack, filed a case with Bheramara Police Station against eight people, including Ariful.

Ariful was on the run. Police were yet to arrest anyone.

Nur Islam Khondkar, officer-in-charge of the station, claimed that seven to eight friends and relatives of the stalker took part in the attack. He said they were trying to arrest them.

Students and teachers of several local schools and colleges formed a human chain in Bheramara yesterday, protesting the killing and demanding the arrest of the culprits. Several hundred other people joined it.

self-declared democratic socialist senator from Vermont, even as he has vowed to fight on until the California primary on June 7.

"The people in every state in this country should have the right to determine who they want as president and what the agenda of the Democratic Party should be. That's why we are in this race until the last vote is cast," Sanders said in a statement.

"That is why this campaign is going to the Democratic National Convention in Philadelphia with as many delegates as possible to fight for a progressive party platform."

'PRESUMPTIVE NOMINEE'
Trump swept all five presidential races held Tuesday, strengthening his grip on the Republican race.

He demolished his rivals Ted Cruz and John Kasich in Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania and Rhode Island -- a stunning show of force by a candidate seen as a populist political savior by millions despite being loathed by the party establishment.

"I consider myself the presumptive nominee," the real estate mogul told a crowd at Trump Tower in New York, despite still being short of the 1,237 delegates required to win the nomination outright.

"As far as I'm concerned, it's over."

Most importantly, the bombastic 69-year-old extended his lead in the all-important race for delegates who will officially choose the Republican nominee at the party's convention in July.

"For weeks, the stop Trump, dump Trump movement has tried to puncture" his rise, James Morone, a political science professor at Brown University, told AFP.

"Today's results overwhelmingly tell you it's not working." 'VERY DUMB!'

Trump's triumph comes in the heated aftermath of the revelation that Cruz and Kasich, desperate to prevent the frontrunner from securing the nomination, were teaming up to block him in future races.

Kasich agreed to forego campaigning in Indiana, a winner-take-all state that votes on May 3 and is the next focus in the GOP race. Cruz will return the favor later in New Mexico and Oregon.

But Trump slammed the alliance as "pathetic" and ineffective.

"This joke of a deal is falling apart, not being honored and almost dead," Trump said on Twitter. "Very dumb!"
