

dance performances. Dance troupes, Srishti Cultural Centre, Nrityalok, Sukanya, Nrityangan and Dibya Sangskritik Sangathan presented group dances set to Tagore songs. Unfortunately, while the artistes of Srishti Cultural Centre were dancing to the song "Aguner Poroshmoni", the music suddenly stopped, to the embarrassment of the dancers who exited the stage. The lights were turned way too low and overall set design was not up to the mark. The accompanying acoustics too were not great to continue live Tagore classics. Yet the soloists did more justice to the

show. Fahim Hossain Chowdhury, Azizur Rahman Tuhin, Nargis Chowdhury and Himadri Shekhar performed songs like "Kholo Kholo Dwar", "Bishwa Jokhon Nidra Mogon", "Tobu Mone-e Rekho" and "Bhalobeshe Sakhi" performance respectively at the event.

Noted singers Mahadev Ghosh, Mohiuzzaman Chowdhury and Roquaiya Hasina presented solos while Jayanta Chattopadhyay and Dahlia Ahmed gave recitations at the event.


# Tagore's lyrical and dance-dramas in spotlight


A scene from "Chitrangada".



## RADIOHEAD releases new album



Radiohead's long awaited new album has finally arrived.

The British band's ninth album -- titled "A Moon Shaped Pool" -- was available for streaming and purchase on Google Play for a short while before being taken down, Pitchfork reports. The 11-track album, Radiohead's first since 2011's "The King of Limbs", is now available for purchase through iTunes and the band's website.

Last week, Radiohead shared new songs and accompanying music videos for "Burn the Witch" and "Daydreaming", both of which are featured on the ablum. The video for "Burn the Witch" is a stop-motion clip that tells the story of a quaint village preparing to burn a witch. "Daydreaming", which was directed by Paul Thomas Anderson and Radiohead, follows an agitated Thom Yorke, who nervously walks around an empty parking garage.

"A Moon Shaped Pool" will be released in physical formats through XL Recordings on June 17. A special edition of the album includes bonus non-album tracks and 32 pages of artwork, along with a piece of halfinch inch master tape from a recording session.
