Three to die, eight get life in three murder cases

Three people were sentenced to death and eight others to life imprisonment in three separate murder cases in Narsingdi, Gazipur and Mymensingh yesterday.

A Narsingdi court sentenced a woman and her lover to death for killing her son in 2011 following an extramarital relationship. Narsingdi Additional District and Sessions Judge Shaheen Uddin sentenced Jahanara Akhter, 28, daughter of Kabir Hossain of Chalna village and Hanif Sheikh, 30, son of Abdus Sattar of Khalapara village in Palash upazila, to death and fined them Tk 10,000 each, reports UNB.

According to the prosecution, Jahanara, wife of Babul Hossain, a Dubai expatriate, developed an extramarital relationship with Hanif Sheikh in absence of her husband. As Sanaulah, 6, son of

Jahanara informed the matter to his father over phone, Jahanara along with Hanif strangled him to death in her house on October 5, 2011. Deeply shocked at the news, Babul returned home the following day and filed a case against them. Later, police arrested Jahanara and Hanif. After examining records and witnesses, Narsingdi Additional District and Sessions Judge Shaheen Uddin handed down the verdict.

Our Gazipur correspondent reported that a court here yesterday sentenced a woman to death for killing her mother-in-law in Kaliakoir upazila in January last year following a family feud. District and Sessions Judge AKM Enamul Haque passed the order. The death penalty awardee is Rozina, wife of Parvez of Mouchak Uttarpara in the upazila.

Rozina hacked her mother-in-law Parveen Akhter on the night of January 15 last year while she was asleep. Parvez was at a relative's house at the time of the incident. Locals caught Rozina the following day and handed her over to the police. After investigation, police pressed charges against Rozina on May 31. After examining the case record and 13 witnesses, the judge pronounced the verdict.

In Mymensingh, a court here sentenced eight people to life imprisonment in a murder case yesterday. The court also fined the convicts Tk 5000 each. In default, they are to suffer six months more in jail, court sources said. The convicts are Md Ziauddin, Abdul Awal Member, his son Nasirul Haque, Sumon Miah, Humayan Kabir, Alamgir Kabir, Abdul Baten and Sirajul Islam. They all hail

from Gandokhola village in Trishal upazila of the district. According to the prosecution, a gang of robbers entered the house of Ramzan Ali of Gandokhola village on the night of September 23, 2003. When the house owner Ramzan Ali tried to resist the gang, they stabbed him. Critically injured Ramzan was rushed to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH) where he where he succumbed to his injuries the following day. Arif Robbani, son of Ramzan lodged a case with Trishal Police Station on September 31. Later, police pressed charge-sheet against the eight. After examining the witnesses and evidence, Judge Mohammad Johirul Kabir of the Second Additional District and Sessions Judge's Court handed down the verdict.

Newly elected UP chairman hacked in Jessore

May 28 voting in two manikganj unions postponed

A newly elected union parishad (UP) chairman was hacked by a gang of criminals at Alamdangapar in Jhikargachha upazila of Jessore district on Monday night. The victim is as Nesar Uddin, 50, chairman-elect of Shangkarpur Union Parishad under the upazila. Villagers said a gang of criminals led by one Ariful intercepted Nesar Uddin's motorbike when he along with two others was going to Ulakal village from Naira area in the upazila at around 9:00pm.

At one stage, the attackers hacked Nesar with sharp weapons, leaving him critically injured. Locals took him to Satkhira Sadar Hospital. Mollah Khabiruddin, officer-in-charge of Jhikargachha Police Station, said a case was filed with the police station. None was arrested in connection with the attack on chairman as of 5:00pm yesterday. Away in Manikganj, the Election Commission (EC) postponed the elections to Garpara and Jagir union parishads under Manikganj Sadar upazila following complaints by two chairman aspirants about snatch-

ing of their nomination papers, reports our correspondent. Farhad Ahmed Khan, deputy secretary at the EC, sent the office order to the district election officer and the returning officers concerned. The elections in the unions were scheduled to be held on May 28. On April 27, ruling party men allegedly snatched nomination papers from BNP-nominated chairman candidates Mohammad Selim Hossain of Jagir union, and independent candidate Sohrab Hossain of Garpara union. SA Zinah Kabir, organising secretary of Manikganj district unit of BNP, and the two candidates filed the complaints to the chief election commissioner, secretary of the EC, deputy commissioner of Manikganj, superintendent of police of Manikganj, district election officer and the returning officers concerned. Following the complaints, the election commissioner took the decision to postpone the elections, district election officer Munir Hossain said. The EC also directed the Regional Election Officer of Dhaka Sarwar Mihir to submit a report after investigation.

Son could not take 'Outcast' by fatwa, death of father back into society after 45 years

A migrant worker travelled all the way to his village home from Kuwait to see the body of his father before his funeral but could not bear the sight of his father's lifeless body and died of cardiac arrest. Hearing the news of his father's demise, Delwar Sikdar, 45, reached his ancestral village Dashazar in Sadarpur upazila of Faridpur Monday afternoon. His family members were preparing for the namaz-e-janaza of his father Tota Sikdar, 75, who died on Sunday. He left behind a wife and a son.

Arriving, Delwar broke down in tears seeing his father's body. He was sitting beside the body but suddenly became completely silent, said his family members. After a while they noticed that Delwar had lost consciousness. The family rushed him to Sadarpur Upazila Health Complex where doctors pronounced him dead. He was buried beside his father in the village graveyard. Locals said Delwar had been a migrant worker in Kuwait for four and half years. He left behind a wife and a son.

Mazid said he was not responsible for the fatwa, but it had been in place since independence. This practice brought shame on the community people whose relatives even refused to visit them, as they were also not allowed entry to the eateries of the bazaar. "No one from our caste in other areas wants to marry our children or build new relationships because of the fatwa," said Sumitra Bal Das, 56, a bamboo product maker. Fifteen years ago, these people could not even sell their dairy or agricultural products to others in the village due of the fatwa, said Faniram Das, 42, a milk trader of the village. He recalled how local thugs poured milk on him and harassed him in public after he tried to sell milk in the bazaar. In the last 15 years, 12 Hindu families sold their land at a very low price to the local influential people and left for India, said village elders. Dhaniram Chandra Das, 48, another member of the community, claimed that the fatwa had more to do with land than with religious sentiments of the Muslims in the area, most of whom are followers of Ahle Hadith. He said Mahishkocha village is the district headquarters of Ahle Hadith. "Some people imposed the fatwa soon after independence only to buy our land at a lower price." Unable to bear the constant harassment, the community members sent a letter to the UNO on April 10, requesting him to look into the matter. Shubhas Chandra, 34, a rice trader, said he could not go inside any tea stalls or restaurants in the bazaar until yesterday. "I went to Shahbuddin Mia's hotel with my two Muslim school friends today [yesterday]. For the first time in my life, we sat together and had snacks

religious minorities, pirs and members of the Shia Muslim minority, EU Ambassador in Dhaka Pierre Mayaudon said they as a partner of Bangladesh cannot ignore the incidents. Following the recent spate of targeted attacks, the US and India have agreed to work together with Dhaka to counter extremism in Bangladesh. "Our three governments -- Bangladesh, India and the United States - all fighting extremism. We're all on the same page here. All three of us are on the same page in that regard," US Ambassador Marcia Bernicat said on Monday. Talking to reporters on the sidelines of the Europe Day celebrations at the Westin Dhaka on Monday evening, the EU head of delegation in Bangladesh said it is pointless to debate whether there is presence of ISIS in Bangladesh or not. Mayaudon said this debate would not serve any good purpose. He called upon the authorities concerned not to spend time to prove the presence of ISIS in Bangladesh. "The purpose is to contain this wave of violence." Mentioning about the recent gruesome murders, the EU envoy said this would be a mistake at this point of time to debate on the issue. Those attacks and mur-


ders were certainly terrorist activities carried out by "underground groups", he stated. Responding to a question from a journalist, he said all should avoid two mistakes -- exaggerating the issue and downgrading the seriousness of this situation. The envoy pointed out that Europe was also facing the terrorist problems and so the EU wants to discuss with friends who are facing the similar problems. "We as a partner cannot ignore it. We have to discuss the issue seriously and we will do it very soon." Earlier, speaking at the celebration programme, Mayaudon said Bangladesh should not lose its colours as the country has a rare combination of unity and diversity based on the tradition of tolerance towards ethnic, cultural and religious pluralism. About the killing of Rajshahi University teacher Prof Rezaul Karim Siddiquee, the ambassador said the teacher was a lover of music and ran a music school in remote Bangladesh. Addressing the event as chief guest, State Minister for Foreign Affairs Md Shahriar Alam reiterated Bangladesh's "zero tolerance" policy against terrorism and extremism. He said Bangladesh stands by Europe in its fight against terrorism.

Refuting the allegation, he said he came to know about the matter from the victims who appealed to him for help. He was shocked to know that such discriminations still existed in this modern era. "I called a meeting with local public representatives, businessmen, alleged fatwa enforcers and locals at Mahishkocha Bazar to stop the illegal practice," said Jahurul. "I took some Hindu people with me and sat with them inside tea stalls and hotels." "If anyone tries to impose the fatwa again, I will conduct mobile court drives against them," the UNO asserted. Although the locals could not say who issued the fatwa against the Hindus, they said the fatwa had been in effect since independence. They alleged that some local goons, led by Mahishkocha union parishad member Abdul Mazid Hosot, had been enforcing the fatwa that the Hindus should not be allowed entry to any of the around 50 tea stalls and restaurants in the bazaar, only 100 metres from the village.
