

Just want to hold on to music ... Luipa

Luipa, one of the new-gen singers of the country, has had a passion for music since her childhood. After she came up fourth in a popular musical talent hunt show she hasn't had to look back, and many doors have opened up for her. In a recent chit-chat with The Daily Star, the singer talked about music and more. Excerpts:

How did you develop a passion for music?

Luipa: In my childhood my teacher came to teach me music at our Bogra home. During my school days, I received a number of awards in musical competitions: National Child Award Competition, National Education Week Prize, Notun Kuri Completion 2000 and Shapla Kuri. I also travelled to Japan and Nepal as a child artiste.

As an adult, how did your career take off?

Luipa: I came into the spotlight after securing fourth position at Channel i Shera Kontho 2010. Since then, I have been busy with music. I'm still learning, though, under the guidance of Priyanka Gope.

How rewarding is it to be a live performer? Luipa: After at Channel i Shera Kontho, I became very busy with stage shows, and it has taken me to some fantastic places. I have traveled to France, Spain, Qatar, Lebanon, Dubai, Singapore,

Malaysia and Japan, and that has been a very rewarding experi-What is your take on playback singing?

Luipa: I love singing playback because when a film song becomes a hit, people are humming it everywhere; that counts as a great success for any singer. I have done playback for films, and want to do more in coming days.

Who do you draw your artistic inspiration from? Luipa: Nilufar Yasmin, Sabina Yasmin, Runa Laila, Sahnaz Rahmatullah and Samina Chowdhury. Our country has such extraordinary singers, I don't have to look far for inspiration.

Do you do anything besides singing? Luipa: I have hosted some TV programmes for Channel i, Rtv and Asian TV, but I have put all that aside; I just want to hold on to music.

Renowned visual artist Kanak Chanpa Chakma has won Bangladesh National Film Award 2014 for best costume design and make-up for the film "Jonakir Alo", directed

by her husband late Khalid Mahmood Mithu. To celebrate the occasion and to honour Kanak Chanpa, Gallery Twenty One has arranged a reception at its premises in

Dhanmondi today at 6 pm. Eminent artist and cultural personality Mustafa Manwar will be present as chief guest.

Kanak Chanpa Chakma is a Bangladeshi Chakma artist who has won national and international awards, and is renowned for her paintings depicting the lives of Bangladeshi ethnic minorities, focusing on the lives of women while combining semi realistic and abstract in the same canvas.

HARLEY QUINN spinoff in the works

Warner Bros. and DC Entertainment are developing a new standalone movie featuring an all-star cast of female DC heroes and villains with Margot Robbie attached to reprise her role of Harley Quinn.

Robbie will also produce the film, which will not only feature Quinn, but popular characters such as Batgirl and Birds of Prey also making appearances. Who exactly will be considered the lead opposite Robbie is still unknown. Exact plot details are also unknown currently.

One of the most popular characters in the DC Comics Universe. Harley Quinn is the Joker's frequent accomplice and lover, and also an ally to the supervillain Poison Ivy. Her origin story relates that she met the Joker while working as a psychiatrist at Arkham Asylum, where the Joker was a patient.

Robbie has not only "Suicide Squad" debuting this summer, but also "Legend of Tarzan" coming out in July, where she will star as Jane opposite Alexander Skarsgard.
