### Book launch and musical evening at AFD

Alliance Française de Dhaka organised a musical event around the book presentation by Dr. Pierre-Alain Baud, titled "Nusrat, the Voice of Faith" on May 17 at La Galerie.

Dr. Pierre-Alain Baud, a French music researcher, journalist and former associate researcher at the Music and the World Religions and Culture Departments, University of Dhaka, was closely associated with Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan's life and music for a decade. The book "The Voice of Faith" is a personal account of the great qawwal's life as observed by Dr. Baud who spent a significant amount of time in Nusrat's company and organised a number of his international programmes worldwide. The book was first published in French and Urdu, then in English. It is now in the process of translation to Bangla.

To make the event lively, a series of events took place

starting with the screening of films "Nusrat, the Last Prophet" and "Nusrat Has Left the Building", and some concert abstracts from Theatre de la Ville (Paris, 1989). Professor Kaiser Haq, gave a critical appreciation of the book. Reputed Lalon singer Farida Parveen discussed on "Lalon and Sufism" at the event, and performed songs.

The event ended with a kobi gaan performance by Arif Dewan and Alya Begum Alo.

## ELTONJOHN confirms role in KINGSMAN 2



Not too long ago, there was a report floating around that stated Sir Elton John was up for a role in "Kingsman: The Golden Circle". It officially panned out yesterday, and Sir Elton himself confirmed it with a poster that could only come from him.

The famed music star took to his official Instagram to deploy the fitting poster for "Kingsman: The Golden Circle". With a pair of sunglasses that are reminiscent of something he would have worn back in his 1970's-era performances, and the quote "Wednesday night's alright for fighting", the teaser poster to Matthew Vaughn's action-comedy sequel looks like it'll quite possibly see John play-

ing himself, or a character very much like himself.

While Sir Elton claims that this is his first film role since 1975's "Tommy", the standard length of a film performance by Sir Elton John isn't an extensive affair. Keeping that in mind, Sir Elton did have cameo appearances in two music themed films, "Spice World" and "The Country Bears", as well as played the narrator in "The Road to El Dorado" - an animated film which he also wrote several songs for.

With the level of seriousness the spy fiction series has taken itself with, a larger-than-life laugh is certainly not out of order when it comes to the 2017 sequel, and Sir Elton would be just the type of celebrity to bring that sort of moment to life.

## Aishwarya's Cannes look draws derision

Bollywood actress Aishwarya Rai Bachchan's red carpet walk at the Cannes Film Festival has seldom failed to hit the media headlines. It was not any exception this year too.

The actress is celebrating 15 years of representing India at the prestigious festival, promoting French cosmetic products LÓreal and her latest work "Sarbjit", a film about a sister's fight for getting justice for her brother who is convicted and sentenced to death in Pakistan.

However, her walk at the red carpet in Cannes this time evoked mixed reactions from the fashion police and aficionados. While her sartorial choice was commended on day one, the 42-year-old actress' lavender-blue lipstick two days later while posing with the cast of "Sarbjit" drew derision on the social media.

Aishwarya earned plaudits wearing a studded champagnecoloured couture gown by Kuwaiti designer Ali Younes. On day two she looked gorgeous in a red ruffled gown by Naeem Khan. On another occasion, she was seen in a heavily-embellished floor-sweeping, golden-brown coloured 'bandhgala' jacket.

While promoting her latest film at the French Rivera, the Indian beauty teamed her purple lips with a flower-strewn Rami Kadi off-shoulder dress and completed her look with gothic eyes and high ponytail.

However, it is the purple lipstick that has seen the actress

being trolled on Twitter and Facebook.

But Aishwarya says she was not under stress about her red carpet look at the Cannes. "I was not nervous (for the look at the Cannes) as it's been 15 years representing L'Oreal here. I have been part of the jury here for two years or so and had come here for 'Devdas'. I belong to showbiz forever so plain dress up has become a way of life depending upon the occasion," she said in an interview.

"I am an actor by my career choice. I enjoy fashion and I treat it like art and I have a life, a family. So, I am not focusing on all of this. So it (look) doesn't stress me out... it doesn't get me nervous.. I am a professional," she added.

Aishwariya said she did not have the time to look at all the choices the fashion industry "was keen on spoiling me with because I was very busy with 'Sarbjit' promotions."

#### "Trainspotting 2" to release in February



Sony has dated "T2: Trainspotting" in the US for February 3, 2017 in select theatres with a wide release on February 10.

The sequel opens in the UK on Jan. 27. Shooting began in Edinburgh on Monday with Danny Boyle, who also directed the original. Ewan McGregor, Jonny Lee Miller, Ewen Bremner and Robert Carlyle will reprise the roles of Renton, Sick Boy, Spud and Begbie, respectively.

The sequel, based on characters created by Irvine Welsh, also reunites Boyle with screenwriter John Hodge and the rest of the principal cast of the 1996 cult classic.

Sony said last year that it planned to release the film in 2017 to mark the 21st birthday of the original film. Based on the novel of the same name by Welsh, the original Hodge screen-play received an Academy Award nomination. The story, set in the late '80s, follows a group of heroin addicts in an economically depressed area of Edinburgh. The film was produced for \$2 million and generated a worldwide gross of more than \$70 million, launching the careers of McGregor, Carlyle and Boyle.
