FOUR DAYS AFTER CYCLONE ROANU

Victims of Bhola's Tazumuddin crying for food, water, medicine

Thousands of people of Tazumuddin upazila under the district are passing days under the open sky amid dire need of foods, water, medicine, and other relief materials, four days after cyclone Roanu battered the area on Saturday.

Yesterday morning, this reporter along with other newsmen visited Tazumuddin Bazar and around two hundred houses of Shashiganj, Dewanpur, Balykandi, and Mahajankanda villages in Chandpur union of Tazumuddin and talked to a number of victims.

Water borne diseases have started affecting people, especially children and women, while lack of drinking water, oral saline and medicine made the situation all the more serious. "We did not get a single kg

of rice or any food as relief. We are managing meal once a day, taking help from relatives or friends who are less affected," said Shakibur Rahman, a shopkeeper of Tazumuddin Bazar. "My sister Rehena Begum

died by the storm but none came to help us. I managed a shroud and buried her with much difficulty," said Rafiquddin of Mahajankanda. The people, many of whom

looked weak apparently due to lack of food, were seen busy to save whatever they could from the debris of their destroyed houses.

"I got a little injured but I could not go to hospital as I cannot move alone," said Honufa, an elderly woman.

Many of the injured could not even receive treatment locally, as dispensaries and medicine shops got badly

Raped by neighbour, schoolgirl tries to commit suicide in Mymensingh

A speech impaired woman was raped allegedly by a neighbour at Rasulpur village in Chougachha upazila of Jessore on Monday. The 19-year-old victim, a

widow, who used to live with her mother at the village, is now undergoing treatment at Jessore Medical College Hospital. Police quoted victim's family

members as saying that Ohidul Islam, 25, of the village, forcibly took the woman to a nearby bush while she was taking her goats to a field around 5:00pm. Ohidul, son of Sikandar Ali,

He later raped the girl inside a nearby bush and threatened her not to disclose the matter, Officer-in-Charge Kamrul Islam of Kotwali Police Station said.

Being shamed by the incident, the girl took poison in a bid to commit suicide on Sunday evening.

The girl finally revealed the matter to her family members when they asked her about the reason behind her suicide attempts, the OC added.

Meanwhile, a Mymensingh court on Sunday sent a youth to jail after police produced him before the court on charge of raping a six-year-old girl in Nandail upazila on Saturday evening.

The arrestee, Mohammad Wayeskuruni, 22, a day labourer, is son of Rais Uddin of Barunakanda village in Nandail

Hasina would formally inaugurate the Chancery Bhaban on May 29. A large number of high-profile Japanese government leaders, lawmakers, officials and other dignitaries are expected to attend the ceremony.

Foreign ministry officials say the premier will fly for Tokyo to attend the G7 Outreach Meetings on June 27 on the sidelines of the G7 Summit in Ise-Shima, Japan.

Apart from holding a bilateral meeting with Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe on May 28, Hasina would have the opportunity to meet G7 leaders as well as other heads of states and governments.

The mangoes and litchis would be carried in a special aircraft, in which Hasina and her entourage would travel to Tokyo, the state minister said.

He said the guests at the inauguration ceremony would be entertained with Rajshahi's famous mangoes and litchis. "I am also sending mangoes personally for the Japanese finance minister in the same aircraft," he added.

The construction of the chancery in Tokyo was a project taken in 2011 following allotment of a piece of land by the Japanese govern-

However, the project hit the snag as it had been facing legal, bureaucratic and technical complexities for more than three years, officials said. Finally, under a changed law, Japanese firm Muramoto Corporation constructed the chancery at a cost of 1.143 billion Japanese yen (equivalent to Tk 9.944 million).

Bangladesh has got an allotment of a 714-squaremetre piece of land in the diplomatic zone of Tokyo at a cost of 1.117 billion Japanese yen in April 2008 under a condition that the complex be constructed by June 30, 2012.

In default, the Bangladesh embassy was supposed to face a penalty of 111.7 million yen.

However, after a series of successful negotiations, the Bangladesh government has managed to extend the deadline and completed the

G7 OUTREACH MEETINGS Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe has invited a number of heads of states and governments, including Hasina, of non-G7 countries and chairpersons of international organisations to partially take part in the summit.

construction recently.

This will be Hasina's second trip to Japan in her current tenure since she visited the country on May 25-28, 2014. Earlier, she visited Japan in 1997 and 2010.

Diplomatic sources say though Hasina is going to attend a multilateral forum, she will have an important bilateral meeting with her Japanese counterpart when the two leaders discuss an entire range of bilateral issues, especially Japanese assistance in large development projects in Bangladesh.

Hasina will also hold a meeting with the Japanese business community to encourage them for investment in Bangladesh, considering the current stable political environment and sound economic growth, they add. She will also address a gathering of Bangladesh community in Japan.

Japan has indicated that the topic of one of the outreach meetings will focus on Asia. In another outreach session, participants will address the Sustainable Development Goals with a focus on Africa. From Asean and South

Asian states, the heads of states and governments of Laos, Vietnam, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Papua New Guinea have been invited. In addition, the head of

state and government of Chad -- the current chairperson of the African Union -and the chairpersons of the UN, OECD, ADB, IMF and the World Bank are also

Urging all not to attend such ceremonies, he said, "If you can, sit quietly and remember any unwritten moment of my life."
