ZIDANE BRUSHES ASIDE 'OLIVE BRANCH'

Real Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane swept aside references to his dramatic 2006 World Cup final sending-off during a press conference ahead of their Champions League final against Atletico. Former France star Zidane was sensationally sent off in the 2006 final after headbutting Italian defender Marco Materazzi. Retired Inter Milan star Materazzi appeared to offer an olive branch by claiming he would support Real in their bid for an 11th title at Milan's San Siro stadium. But Zidane was reluctant to accept, completely dodging the question, saying: "I'm happy with the work the team has done so far. We've worked so hard to get to this final and we believe in our chances." He added: "If he [Materazzi] said what he said, then good. But I've got nothing to say. I'm doing my job and I'm pleased with what we've done so far."



Sensational Rashford

Roy Hodgson insisted Marcus Rashford's dream debut for England came as no surprise after the Manchester United sensation staked his claim for a Euro 2016 place with a record-breaking strike in a 2-1 win over Australia.

England manager Hodgson had claimed the world would be watching to see if Rashford could cope with the pressure of what amounted to a onegame audition for a place in his final 23-man squad for the Euros.

And Rashford took just 135 seconds to deliver an emphatic response as the teenage striker's lethal volley opened the scoring in Friday's Euro 2016 warm-up at the Stadium of Light.

No player of such a tender age had ever found the net on his England debut and at the age of 18 years and 209 days, Rashford is behind only former Liverpool star Michael Owen (18 years and 164 days) and United captain Wayne Rooney (17 years 317 days) in the list of the youngest scorers in an England shirt.

Germany turn to youth AFP, Berlin

World champions Germany are set to blood a crop of rising stars in Sunday's friendly at home to Slovakia as head coach Joachim Loew fine-tunes his Euro 2016 squad.

Loew purposefully chose Slovakia, who will make their debut at a European championships in France, as they are expected to play in a similar style to Germany's Group C opponents Ukraine, Poland and Northern Ireland.

Slovakia "will try to knock us out of our rhythm" in Augsburg, according to Loew, who wants to see how some of the new blood in the Germany squad cope with senior football.

Uncapped Joshua Kimmich, Dortmund's Julian Weigl, Leverkusen's Julian Brandt and Schalke's Leroy Sane, none of whom have yet turned 21, are all set to make their debuts.

Real Madrid were crowned European champions for an unprecedented 11th time when Cristiano Ronaldo scored the winning penalty in a 5-3 shootout victory over Atletico

Madrid on Saturday.

The Champions League final had finished 1-1 after extra time with Sergio Ramos having bundled the ball home to give Real the lead in the 15th minute.

Antoine Griezmann missed a penalty at the start of the second half for Atletico when he fired his shot against the bar.

Atletico, beaten in their two previous final appearances, including the most recent against Real in 2014, suffered a series of let-offs before substitute Yannick Carrasco rifled in the equaliser in the 79th minute to send the game into extra time.

Juanfran missed Atletico's fourth penalty in the shootout and Ronaldo converted to seal victory for Real.

"What an amazing feeling," Real forward Gareth Bale said. "We showed resilience and what we are made of. It was a war of attrition. I cannot describe how it feels.

"The boys gave everything and we deserve it. It the area to give away a penalty. was a final and you have to win. We just kept going and we can lift the trophy again now," the Welshman added.

Serena, Novak march on

Top seeds Novak Djokovic and Serena Williams both swept into the last 16 at the French Open on a rain-hit Saturday in Paris, while Dominic Thiem confirmed his status as an outsider to win the men's title.

French hopes of a first home win in 33 years, meanwhile, were dealt a heavy blow when sixth-seed Jo-Wilfried Tsonga retired with a groin injury in the first set of his match with Ernests Gulbis.

Djokovic, who can become just the eighth man to win all four Grand Slam tournaments should be emerge triumphant next weekend, beat Britain's Aljaz Bedene 6-2, 6-3, 6-3 just before the light became too poor to play in.

The Serb, winner of the last three Grand Slam tournaments, has seen his chances of adding the French title considerably improved by the shock injury withdrawal of ninetime champion Rafael Nadal.

Williams, seeking an Open-era, record-equalling 22nd Grand Slam title, was a set up and about to tackle a second set tie-break against France's Kristina Mladenovic when a thunderstorm sent everyone scurrying for cover.

On the resumption, more than two and a half hours later, the top seed and defending champion needed five match points to finish the job going through 6-4, 7-6 (12/10) with Ukraine 18th seed Elina Svitolina next in her line of fire following her victory over former champion Ana Ivanovic.

Uzzal, Tanzila fastest sprinters

Uzzal Chandra Sutradhar of Narshingdi and Tanzila Akter of BKSP became the fastest sprinters in their respective 100m dashes in the adolescent category of the 32nd National Junior Athletics Championship at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Uzzal, who hails from Kishoreganj but participated for Narshingdi district, clocked 10:83 seconds to become the fastest, beating BKSP's Zahir Raihan and Marconi Joy by a fair distance. The 19-year-old sprinter, who had become champion in the boys' category of the same event in 2013, was happy to have beaten competitors from BKSP.

"It's always a special feeling if you can beat the participants of BKSP. I'm glad I could do that. I have trained, along with 10 others, for one and a half months with BJMC coach Brojo Gopal Das," said the youngster, who had also won a silver medal in long jump on the previous day.

Uzzal, who is a second-year student of Jessore Science and Technology University, said he wants to do a job in defence forces while his ultimate aim is to get into the national reckoning and do well at the South Asian Games.

Tanzila, meanwhile, said she was happy to have realised her dream of becoming the fastest sprinter in her age category after having failed in three previous attempts. The higher secondary school student from BKSP took 13:10seconds to win the gold, finishing 0.07 seconds ahead of her teammate Disha Sultana and 0.95 seconds ahead of Asha Khatun of Natore.

"I have participated three times previously in junior athletics and had won three silver medals in 2013. But this is the first time I won the first prize in 100m sprint, which was always my dream," said the girl who hails from Sujanagar in Pabna.

Tanzila, who also won silver medals in 200m sprint and high jump in the current championship, said her dream is to break the 100m national record currently held by Nazmun Nahar Beauty and the 200m national record held by Subarna Akter.

Meanwhile, only one new record was set on the second day of the championship yesterday, with BKSP's Sheuly Khatun setting a new record in 400m sprint clocking 1:65 minutes.
