Ambitious targets set deliberately

Muhith says big budget planned as implementation capacity rises

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Finance Minister AMA Muhith yesterday said he deliberately set an ambitious revenue generation target in the upcoming budget, hoping for more tax collection by the National Board of Revenue.

"I have said in the budget speech that it is deliberately ambitious," he told reporters at a post-

Memorial Auditorium. Muhith said the NBR's revenue generation performance was "unfortunate" in the

budget briefing in the capital's Osmani

outgoing fiscal year. "I think this institution has the capacity to move further up the ladder," he said,

ustifying the revenue generation growth target of 30 percent in the fiscal 2016-17. Muhith was confident that the revenue

target would be achieved.

The NBR's capacity had increased in the



last seven years, as its workforce rose by several thousands and it opened many offices at the upazila level, he said.

"I think the NBR has the capacity to deliver on the targets. I have set the target on the basis of NBR's strength."

The government formulated a plan so the revenue target could be reached, and the plan's implementation would start next month,

said the minister. In order to boost revenue collection, more NBR offices would be set up in phases at the upazila level. The NBR now has offices

in 96 upazilas, according to him. At 10.3 percent, Bangladesh has one of the lowest tax-to-GDP ratios in the world.

"Only one or two countries are below Bangladesh. We have to change our habit and pay taxes instead of making a hue and cry about the services the government

Muhith hints Private investment biggest challenge

CPD says new industries, additional job creation badly needed

The challenge of attracting private invest-· ment remains as daunting as ever, as the proposed budget did not give any clear outline to mobilise additional private funds · required to kick-start new industrial activi-· ties and to create the badly needed jobs, the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) said in its reaction yesterday.

The GDP growth target for the next fiscal year has been set at 7.2 percent which, : according to the CPD, is moderate com-· pared to the provisional figure of 7.05 per-SEE PAGE 2 COL 4 · cent for the outgoing fiscal. However, to

achieve this private investment has to be 23.3 percent of the GDP or Tk 80,000 crore, which is 1.5 percentage points higher than the current level.

"But there is nothing in the budget about the source of this additional money," said Dr Debapriya Bhattacharya, distinguished fellow of the CPD, in his presentation.

In his budget speech, Muhith said that during 2010-2015, 47 lakh people entered the labour market, 98 percent of them in the local market. But he did not mention that the pace of additional job creation in 2014 and 2015 came down to only 3 lakh a year SEE PAGE 2 COL 4
