Colombia crush USA

Colombia wrecked the United States' hopes of a winning start to the Copa America Centenario as goals from James Rodriguez and Cristian Zapata gave the South Americans a comfortable 2-0 victory here Friday.

AC Milan's Zapata and Real Madrid star Rodriguez struck in the first half before a sell-out 67,439 crowd at the Levi's Stadium in northern California to puncture American hopes of emerging from a difficult Group A.

US coach Jurgen Klinsmann's side had hoped to score an upset victory to emulate the Americans' famous defeat of Colombia at the 1994 World Cup in the United States.

Garbine stuns Serena

Wins her maiden Grand Slam title

Garbine Muguruza won her first Grand Slam title at the French Open on Saturday defeating top seed and defending champion Serena Williams in

the final. Twelve years younger than the American at 22, and playing in the first claycourt final of her career, the Venezuelan-born

Spaniard upset the odds to win 7-5, 6-4. She is the first Spanish woman to win a Grand Slam title since Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario in Paris in 1998 and she is the third straight first time Grand Slam winner after Flavia Pennetta at last year's US Open and Angelique Kerber at the Australian Open.

"I am so excited to play the final of a Grand Slam against one of the best ever players. It's the perfect final and I am so happy," she said.

"I grew up on clay so for Spain and me this is just amazing.

"Serena is a very powerful player and I just tried to fight as hard as I can."

For Williams it was a second straight loss in a Grand Slam final and it wrecked her hopes once again of winning a 22nd Grand Slam title to draw level with Steffi Graf for most wins in the Open era, since 1968.

She will now turn her focus on Wimbledon where she will be the defending champion and a six-time former winner.

Wimbledon final last year, moved 4-2 ahead, but she lost her range two games later to allow the American to level the score. The tall Spaniard was matching Williams

for power and when the title-holder opened the 11th game with a double fault she seized the opportunity to apply some added pressure on her opponent. Her tactics paid off with Williams fail-

ing to cope with a series of explosive baseline groundstrokes.

Aiming to banish 2014 WC failure

For all Vicente del Bosque's confidence that he has the right balance of experience and youth to return Spain to their familiar place on the winner's rostrum, questions remain about his best starting line-up ahead of Euro

On the surface, Spain's qualifying record of nine wins out of 10 going into the tournament looks impressive but they rarely delivered performances to suggest they could pick up a third successive title or banish the memories of their 2014 World Cup failure.

No-one will be keener to prove the doubters wrong than Del Bosque in what looks to be his last hurrah as Spain's

Once again he can call on trusted stalwarts Andres Iniesta, Sergio Busquets, Gerard Pique, Sergio Ramos and Cesc Fabregas, all regulars before or since the 2010 World Cup triumph, this time blending them with a new generation of young players such as Manchester United goalkeeper David de Gea, Atletico Madrid midfielder Koke and Juventus striker Alvaro Morata.

"I really believe in the veterans who have spent a long time with us and we trust the newcomers, who give the squad impulse and fresh blood," said Del Bosque.

"Our objective is to think beyond the two European Championships we've won, because people are only going to value what we do in the next one."

Another triumph will require a settled spine to his team, yet there remains uncertainty over who will start as central striker and in goal, where the manager must decide whether to demote Iker Casillas in favour of

De Gea, whose consistently outstanding performances in the last three seasons contrast with the long-standing captain's waning powers.

Up front, the situation is equally fluid. After leaving out Diego Costa and Paco Alcacer -- top scorer in qualifying -- Del Bosque is likely to opt for Morata as first choice striker, although he made just 16 league starts for Juventus.

Athletic Bilbao striker Aritz Aduriz is in the form of his life at the age of 35 and scored more goals than any other Spaniard



in the campaign but there are doubts about whether his physical, direct style fits in with Spain's possession game.

At the back there remains an alarming lack of depth to cover for Sergio Ramos, who appears to have hit form at the right time after an inconsistent season, and Gerard Pique, who arrives on the back of another brilliant campaign with Barcelona.

Injury to either would be a major headache because the inclusion of Barcelona's Marc Bartra, who has played relatively little first-team football this season, suggests experienced cover is not at hand.

Lionel Messi touched down in California on Friday as Argentina prepared for the possibility that the injured Barcelona superstar may not be fit for next week's Copa America Centenario showdown with Chile.

Messi arrived in the early hours from Barcelona, where on Thursday he had when the draw was held at the Bangladesh Football appeared in court to give evidence in his tax fraud trial which has also embroiled his father. Messi, who suffered a
