

Protesters for shutting down Pak mission

Workers' Party of Bangladesh (WPB) yesterday demanded the government shut down Pakistan High Commission in Dhaka, alleging that the country is hatching a conspiracy against Bangladesh through its mission.

They also burnt Pakistan's national flag and organised a programme to besiege its high commission, protesting the country's awarding "Nishane Pakistan", its highest civilian honour, to the executed war criminal and Jamaat-e-Islami chief Motiur Rahman Nizami.

Demonstrators were not allowed to march to the high commission, said police, adding, later they burnt the flag near Bhatara Police Station.

"Pakistan high commission is spying on us," alleged Fazle Hossain

SEDITION CASE BNP's Aslam put on five-day fresh remand

A Dhaka court yesterday placed BNP leader Aslam Chowdhury on a five-day fresh remand in a sedition case filed allegedly for hatching a conspiracy with Israel's Likud Party and its intelligence agency Mossad to oust the Awami League government in Bangladesh.

Metropolitan Magistrate Mahmudul Hasan passed the order after Fazlul Haque, investigation officer (IO) of the case and inspector of Detective Branch of police, produced Aslam before the court with a seven-day remand prayer.

Aslam was produced before the court on completion of his seven-day remand in the case.

In the forwarding report, the IO said they gleaned vital clues from Aslam about the incident, which were now being verified.

So, he needed to be remanded afresh for gleaning more clues, said the IO.

Earlier on May 31, another Dhaka court placed Aslam on a seven-day remand in the case.

Aslam was shown arrested in the case on May 27 after he was sued for the alleged sedition on May 26.

Earlier on May 15, Aslam was picked up from the capital's Khilkhet over the alleged plot.

Later, he was remanded for seven days showing him arrested under Section 54 of the Criminal Procedure Code.

But police on Tuesday appealed for discharging Aslam from the charges as he was shown arrested in three regular cases including the sedition one.

On May 24, he was also shown arrested in two arson cases filed during BNP-led 20-party alliance's anti-government agitation in January last year. Police later prayed for a 20-day remand. The court fixed June 15 for remand hearing.

JS sitting on budget adjourned for lack of eager discussants

Deputy Speaker Fazle Rabbi Miah was forced yesterday to adjourn the parliament sitting at 12:15pm for lack of speakers on the proposed budget for 2016-17 fiscal year.

On the very first day, the sitting concluded two hours after the day's business started.

Adjourning the session till 10:30am, today, Fazle Rabbi Miah said, "I'm informing with a great sorrow that no name from the opposition MPs was submitted. Many ruling party MPs are present in the House, but not willing to deliver speech. So, I'm compelled to adjourn the session."

The deputy speaker also said 45 hours were fixed for the general discussion.

He also said some 10 hours are allocated for opposition lawmakers, while the rest of the time is for ruling party MPs and independent MPs.

As per rules, ruling and opposition party whips submitted the participants' names to the speaker. They also fixed the time for the participants. Following the list, the speaker asked the MPs to make their statements.

Four Awami League MPs and an independent MP took part in the discussion on the first day.

Manna admitted to hospital

Nagorik Oikya Convener Mahmudur Rahman Manna was taken to the capital's Ibrahim Cardiac Hospital from Dhaka Central Jail yesterday, as he was suffering from renal and cardiac ailments.

Nazmul Hasan, convener of Nagorik Chhatra Oikya, said he was rushed to the hospital from the jail after he felt severe pain in his chest. The High Court on May 31 directed the prison authorities to admit him to a hospital. He was arrested on February 25 last year after a telephone conversation with BNP leader Sadeque Hossain Khoka about strengthening the anti-government movement was leaked. The HC also dropped his bail petition from its hearing list as it was refused.

in the last two years, Nirmol also castigated the prevailing culture of impunity for such attacks.

Different organisations including Dhaka Young Men's Christian Association, Jatiya Church Parishad, Dhaka Christian Co-operatives, and Bangladesh Garo Chhatra Shongothon joined the human chain.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Udichi Shilpi Goshthi, and Bangladesh Chhatra Union (BCU) and Bangladesh Jubo Union (BJU), too, held separate rallies in the capital, protesting the murders and demanding

proper investigation and trial, reports our DU correspondent.

"Such killings will continue if there will be no justice for their murder," BCU president Lucky Akhter told the Udichi's rally held at Shahbagh. She also alleged that the government was trying to cover up the incidents.

BJU general secretary Hafiz Adnan Riad said, "51 murders have been perpetrated in same manner in 18 months, but there is no trial."

The speakers demanded the government strengthen security measures and conduct proper probe into the all incidents.

Four railway officials get bail

Mazharul Islam gave the order after they surrendered before his court seeking bail. Earlier Jahangir Alam, a railway engineer, and Abdus Salam, a contractor, secured bail on different dates.

Jihad died after falling into a 17-inch diameter abandoned shaft, near his house at Bangladesh Railway Colony while playing with friends on December 26, 2014. His body was pulled out by a band of indomita-

ble volunteers the following day, around 15 minutes after the fire service called off a near 23-hour search. On April 17 of 2015, Shahjahanpur Police Sub-inspector Abu Zafar pressed charges against Salam and Jahangir over the death. But on June 4 last year, victim's father filed a no-confidence (Naraji) petition against the investigation into the incident.

Later, the court ordered further investigation and following the order detective on May 31 pressed charges against six including the four.
