Final spot a toss-up between Gazi Group and Prime Bank

BFF keen to keep de Kruif

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) is set to offer Dutch coach Lodewijk de Kruif another partial contract for the national team's Asian Cup qualifying playoff against Bhutan in September and October following the team's 'significant improvement' in

the home match against Tajikistan. BFF president Kazi Salahuddin, vice presidents Mohiuddin Ahmed Mohi and Tabith Awal yesterday had a meeting with de Kruif, who is scheduled to leave for

Netherlands this morning. "We have seen a significant improvement of the national team from the away match to the home match. Today was the end of our small contract with our head coach Lodewijk

de Kruif. "We have had discussion with the BFF president for a long-term plan in which we have a plan to play against Bhutan in the playoff of the Asian Cup qualification and hopefully we will qualify for the next round. Once we confirm a plan, based on which we look forward to a new negotiation, according to which de Kruif and a team of coaching staff will be offered a new contract," said Tabith

after the meeting. Bangladesh had suffered a 5-0 defeat against Tajikistan in Dushanbe last week before getting away with a 1-0 defeat at home on Tuesday. The result saw Tajikistan through to the third qualifying round of the Asian Cup, leaving Bangladesh with an elimination playoff against Bhutan.

It has been learnt that de Kruif has been asked to return to Bangladesh by July 13, two days before the start of the professional football league, to take charge and search for new players from the league. However, the Dutchman has not given his final words citing that he has a contract with a local club in the Netherlands and that he might give his consent after returning home.

De Kruif has guided Bangladesh national team and the Bangladesh U-23 in four wins, five draws and 12 defeats in overall 21 matches.

Bangladesh pace sensation Mustafizur Rahman returned to Dhaka last night from his hometown Satkhira. For the next few days the pacer will follow a rehabilitation programme at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur which will be overseen by team physio Bayjedul Islam and look to improve his

After his return from India where he played a starring role for Sunrisers Hyderabad in the Indian Premier League, Mustafizur had undergone a number of fitness tests. It was later revealed that while there were no serious problems with the bowler, he had lost plenty of weight. It was an aspect that concerned the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB)

and as a result the medical team then decided to create a new rehabilitation programme for the player. Going by BCB president Nazmul Hassan Papon's statement on Sunday, Mustafizur is likely to work on this programme for a minimum of three weeks. After the programme he is expected to go through another

fitness test. Mustafizur had been drafted by English county side Sussex for the ongoing Natwest T20 Blast. He was originally supposed to join the county after his IPL stint, but Sussex granted him leave to recover from his niggles and his IPL exertions. The final decision on whether he will travel to England rests with Mustafizur, and it has

been learnt that even if he does make the trip it will only

be after the Eid celebrations.

England eye whitewash

England have a knack of coming unstuck as they chase a Test series whitewash but they will hope to complete the job against Sri Lanka at Lord's this week -- despite clear signs of improvement from the tourists.

England are 2-0 up with one Test to play, but the match starting on Thursday has more riding on it than it might appear for the hosts after recent series victories ended on a low note.

Last year, having won the Ashes, England suffered an innings and 46-run defeat by Australia in the fifth Test at The Oval.

There was a similarly heavy reverse in South Africa in January when, 2-0 up with one to play, England lost the fourth Test at Centurion by 280 runs.

Although they won the second Test against Sri Lanka in Chesterle-Street by nine wickets, there were warning signs for England during that success.

A typically good Lord's pitch could make life harder still for fast bowlers in London, with the most even contest of the series so far in prospect.

Eight booters 'cleared to play'


Eight footballers have been cleared to play the domestic competitions for their respective new clubs, subject to the return of payment they had taken from Sheikh Jamal DC.

Though the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) has not yet made it public, it has been learnt that the BFF players' status committee has distributed those eight players among three clubs -- Chittagong Abahani, Sheikh Russel KC and Abahani -- on the basis of the players' registration forms as well as instructions from the High Court. The committee has also informed the respective clubs of the decision yesterday.

A high court bench on April 13 disposed a writ petition of Sheikh Jamal DC and instructed the players' status committee to settle it as per FIFA and BFF regulations and the court also instructed the BFF to settle it within two weeks after the copy of judgement reached the BFF. Yesterday was the last day for settlement.

A source inside the BFF said that those eight players will not be allowed to play for their respective clubs until they return the advance payments taken from Sheikh Jamal DC.

Mamunul Islam, Sohel Rana, Nasiruddin Chowdhury, Raihan Hasan and Yeamin Munna signed for Chittagong Abahani; Jamal Bhuiyan and Alamgir Kabir Rana signed for Sheikh Russel KC while Shahidul Alam Sohel signed for Dhaka Abahani.

Bankers keep hopes alive
