Targeted killing continues. Even on the first day of a nationwide special crackdown on militancy yesterday, a volunteer of a Hindu monastery was hacked to death, the latest in a spate of such killings in the country. The victim, Nityaranjan

Pandey, 60, was a sebak at Sree Sree Thakur Anukulchandra Satsang ashram in Pabna Sadar upazila.

"Nityaranjan was murdered in a fashion similar to that of the recent killings carried out by suspected Islamist militants, Alamgir Kabir, superintendent of police in Pabna, told The Daily Star.

"We cannot say anything for sure before investigation, but the style of the attack

suggests that religious extremisms might have been involved in the incident."

Over the last two years or so, suspected militants have attacked and killed university professors, writers, publishers, secular bloggers, gay rights activists, foreigners, policemen and members of religious minorities, including Shia and Sufi Muslims, Christians and

Hindus. At least eight people have become victims of such killings since May 1. They include a Christian grocer, a Hindu priest and the wife of a police superintendent hailed for successful anti-militancy drives.


Teen boy returns home from Malaysia in mentally unstable state after being physically, sexually abused

A 15-year-old who boarded a boat in 2014 at Teknaf in Cox's Bazar believing he would earn a fortune in Malaysia, returned home on June 3 after being physically, emotionally and sexually abused.

"I'll go back home. I'll meet my cousin there," said the traumatised boy at a shelter in Putrajaya, some 25km south of Kuala Lumpur, when this correspondent met him on May 28. Asked where his home was, he said, "Brazil." Asked who his cousin was, he said, "Pele."

Such was the mental state of the now 17-year-old who
