# Who killed them?

3 bodies found in Jessore; police say victims were 'robbers' killed by 'mob'; villagers know nothing about it

Police claimed that three "robbers" were killed in a "mob beating" while they were reportedly trying to commit a robbery in Krishnanagar of Jessore's Jhikargacha early yesterday, but the villagers said they knew nothing about the incident.

Locals found three bodies in Bangabandhu Park on the Kobadak river yesterday morning.

The identities of the three victims, aged between 30 and 40, could not be known immediately. It was not clear whether they were shot or hacked to death.

Mollah Khabir Ahmed, officer-in-charge of Jhikargacha Police Station, said around 3:00am, the villagers caught the three "robbers" while a gang was trying to commit a robbery in Krishnanagar.

The villagers then beat up the "robbers", leaving them dead on the spot.

However, locals said they had no information about any robbery incident in the area on that night. They rather thought that the victims were killed somewhere else and left there later.

Local ward councillor Shariful Islam said he went to the spot after hearing the news. He said he did not hear of any attempted robbery or any mob beating in the village.

Mehedi and Meherul of Krishnanagar and Hasan Ali of Mobarakpur village also said they heard that three "robbers" were killed in a "mob beating" during a robbery. But no such incident took place in the village, they added.

On Monday night, Assistant Sub-Inspector Towhidul Islam was stabbed by robbers in Wapda area of Jhikargacha. He is now undergoing treatment at Jessore Medical College Hospital.

OC Mollah Khabir said police would investigate whether the victims were involved in the attack.

#### Ashraf's JSD comments irk Hasina

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, also the president of ruling Awami League, has expressed frustration over her party's General Secretary Syed Ashraful Islam's recent remarks laying into Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal.

She also said Ashraf should not have made such remarks in the present situation, said sources.

Hasina was talking to some AL leaders, including a minister, who met her in parliament on Tuesday night, said the sources, adding that she did not, however, discuss the issue with Ashraf.

On Monday, Ashraf said his party may have to repent for inducting a JSD member into the cabinet, and accused the JSD of making grounds for Bangabandhu's assassination.

The AL leader went to the UK on a personal visit

yesterday, said sources. JSD President and Information Minister Hasanul Haque Inu yesterday said it was not the time for "mudslinging" between the 14-party alliance partners. Rather, he added, it was the time for stamping out SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

## Trump to push Three more killed in 'shootouts'

Three people, including the prime accused in a police official murder case, were killed in "shootouts" with law enforcers in Pabna, Brahmanbaria and Jessore yesterday.

The dead are Rubel Hossain and Jibon. Identity of another deceased could not be known. Rubel, son of Idris Ali of Diar Baghoil

village in Pabna's Ishwardi upazila, was the prime accused in the Assistant Town Subinspector (ATSI) Sujaul Islam Suja murder case, police said.

Suja was found dead on a field near Pakshey Railway Station on October 5 last year. He was posted at the Pakshey police camp.

Ishwardi Police Station's Officer-in-Charge Biman Kumar Das said law

enforcers arrested Rubel from near his home around 11:00pm on Tuesday. Later, a police team along with Rubel conducted a drive to arrest his associate Ibra Hossain. "When police reached Natunpara area near the Padma river around

11:30pm, Rubel's associates opened fire on them, forcing the law enforcers to fire back," he said.

Rubel was caught in the line of fire and died on the spot, while his accomplices managed to flee the scene. His body was sent to Pabna Medical SEE PAGE 10 COL 5

The minister said the US envoy wanted to know about the "huge arrests" in SEE PAGE 10 COL 6


### Never too old to learn
