Apparel exporter sued for money laundering

The Customs Intelligence yesterday filed a money laundering case against a garment factory, SN Design Ltd, on allegations of siphoning off about Tk 100 crore from Bangladesh.

SN Design shipped 297 apparel consignments abroad between 2010 and 2015 but did not bring back any proceeds from the exports, according to the Customs Intelligence and Investigation Directorate, an office under the National Board of Revenue.

"We have concluded that an offence has been committed and the money has been transferred to other accounts," said Moinul Khan, director general of Customs Intelligence.

This is the first time that the NBR has filed a money laundering case after the government revised the law to empower the revenue authority to investigate allegations of money laundering.

The Customs Intelligence Directorate said it started investigating the case in December 2015 by detaining seven containers at the Chittagong Port prior to shipment.

Three-digit number in the offing for all emergency services

The government is looking to bring all emergency services under a three-digit short code platform, as in developed countries, by the first half of next year.

At present, there are more than 50 short codes across the citizen services, including healthcare, telecom, disaster management, maternity and agriculture.

For example, Grameenphone users can dial 102 to seek help from Bangladesh Fire Service & Civil Defence.

"We want to bring all the emergency services under one "It is one of my umbrella -- it will be more effective that way. It is one of my dream projects and I want to make it happen," said Tarana Halim, state minister for telecom.

There are more than 13 crore active SIMs in Bangladesh, which means most of the citizens are connected, she said. "And if they can dial a short code to get emergency ser-

vices like fire brigade, ambulance, police and so on, it will improve their lives." The three digit codes 100 and 111 are currently free. The

telecom regulator has been directed to fix a three-digit short code for that end, said an official of the telecom division.

According to Bangladesh Telecommunication TARANA HALIM, STATE Regulatory Commission's short code policy, there is no scope to create any three digit code.


