

BCB BOARD MEETING TODAY Selection policy, BKSP match in focus

The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) will host an important meeting at its headquarters in Mirpur today where a long-standing and

proven selection policy may change. A major decision regarding the extension of the national team's head coach Chandika Hathurusingha is expected to be finalised during the meeting. The board is all set to extend

the tenure of Hathurusingha, who joined the Tigers in June 2014 on a two-year contract, till the 2019 ICC World Cup to be held in England. The main focus however will be the outcomes regarding the selection panel and the kind of ruling the game's governing body will take with regards to the Dhaka Premier League match

between Abahani and Prime

Doleshwar, which got postponed last

Sunday as the umpires had decided not

to continue the game following an

argument with the Abahani players. Abahani skipper, Tamim Iqbal was the man in focus as he and the umpires were involved in a heated exchange. The match was supposed to continue in the reserve day, but didn't. The tournament committee towards the end, forwarded the matter to the BCB's disciplinary

committee for a decision.

On June 5, BCB president Nazmul Hassan Papon said that the board would follow a selection system that would involve two separate groups, including the three national selectors, the head coach and the team manager. The meetings of this committee would be convened by the head of the cricket operations committee.

BCB's move to bring changes in the selection policy has already triggered criticism.

It shocked many when Papon said that the team manager would have a say in the national selection. The reason for his inclusion, he said was so that he could voice the opinions of the captain and the players.

If the current team manager, Khaled Mahmud, does get to have a say in the matter of the national selection, then it could lead to quite a unique example in world cricket as far as cricket administration is concerned.

Aside from being the national team manager, Mahmud is a director at the BCB, the chairman of the BCB's development committee and the current coach of Abahani.

The board may also announce the formation of a bowling review committee, discuss the future national tours and finalise a new national bowling coach.

Zimbabwe stun India

The shorter the contest, the tighter the contest. Zimbabwe, outclassed in all three ODIs, pulled off their second successive 20over win over India, shading a match of exceedingly tiny margins by two runs to go 1-0 up in the T20I series at the Harare Sports Club yesterday.

It came down to India captain MS Dhoni and what he could do with the last ball, as it has so many times in his career. India needed four, and Neville Madziva bowled a wide slower ball. Dhoni, jumping across to reach it, slapped it wide of deep point, but could not generate enough power to beat the fielder. He simply moved a few yards to his right and kept India's captain to a single, sparking wild celebrations among the home team players.

It was like rising from the ashes for Zimbabwe, who failed to score more than 168 in the ODIs, but on Saturday they appeared to rediscover their joy for the game and posted 170 for six on the back of Elton Chigumbura's unbeaten 54.

Manish Pandey led India's reply with his 48, but Zimbabwe chipped away at the visitors to restrict them to 168 for six and win by two runs.

Shuvo safe now

Lack of proper helmets, ambulance a concern

Off the third ball of the 25th over of the game between Abahani and Victoria at Mirpur yesterday, a bouncer from Taskin Ahmed hit the right side of Sohrawadi Shuvo's neck.

Shuvo was immediately carried off the field and taken to the Bangladesh Cricket Board's (BCB's) medical room, where he underwent four tests conducted by BCB's sports physician Debashish Chowdhury. Since he managed to pass only three of them, the BCB decided to send him to a hospital.

Unfortunately, he had to wait a while at the BCB's headquarters since there wasn't an ambulance ready for such a scenario at the venue. It was an aspect that was criticised by many who were present at the stadium.

Once at the hospital, he underwent a CT scan and an MRI and the results revealed that the impact had not affected Shuvo's brain and that he was out of danger.

"After the tests it was confirmed that the hit didn't affect his brain. However, the doctors did notice a slight crack in the bone in the report and initially suspected it to be a slight fracture. But later it was revealed that it was something Shuvo had since birth. We will analyse the situation further once he is released," Debashish told The Daily Staryesterday.

"It would have helped if he had worn a helmet built as per the latest regulations. That could have protected his neck," he added.

It was an uneven bounce that surprised Shuvo. He had his eyes on the bouncer and had even ducked to avoid it. However, the ball kept a bit low and as a result, hit the batsman's neck.

Following the match Taskin admitted that he was worried the moment his delivery hit Shuvo. However, after the match, he wrote on Facebook: "Sorry Shuvo Bhai. Get well soon."

Echoing Debashish's thoughts, both Abahani skipper Tamim and national selector Habibul Bashar opined that the board should make it mandatory for players to wear helmets built based on the latest standards, so such accidents can be avoided.
