AVIJIT 'MURDER ACCUSED'

He was 'picked up' 4 months ago

Alleges the crossfire victim's father; his real name is Mukul Rana, not Sharif

The key suspect in blogger-writer Avijit Roy murder, who was killed in a "shootout" on Sunday, had been missing since being kidnapped by some unidentified persons in Jessore four months back, according to his father.

Besides, there is confusion regarding his identity. According to police, he was Sakib alias Sharif alias Saleh alias Arif alias Hadi-1. But his father Abul Kalam Azad said his name is Md Mukul Rana.

Mukul, who was from Baluigachhi village in Satkhira Sadar upazila, was kidnapped by 10 to 12 persons on a microbus from Bashundia intersection in Jessore around 11:00am on February 23, Azad told this newspaper yesterday. Mukul was returning home in Satkhira from his in-law's house at Jagannathpur in Jessore with his newlywed wife Mohua Akter Piya.

It was just four days into his marriage.



With the killers of Sohagi Jahan Tonu yet to be arrested even three months after her brutal murder, Tonu's mother has alleged that her family is kept "under watch".
