PM to blame for deaths of militant suspects: Khaleda

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia yesterday alleged that Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is responsible for deaths of militant suspects including Golam Faizullah Fahim. "Fahim was killed in a

stage-managed drama. Police said Fahim was killed in crossfire, but actually it was not crossfire. He was just killed," Khaleda told an iftar party at a Dhaka hotel, organised by Bangladesh Labour Party, a component in the BNP-led 20-party alliance.

On June 17, Fahim, who was on a 10-day remand in connection with the attack on Madaripur college teacher Ripon Chakraborty, was killed in a "gunfight between his associates and police" in Madaripur Sadar.

BANKING SCAMS

JP MP seeks Muhith's resignation

Jatiya Party MP Ziauddin Ahmed Bablu yesterday in parliament demanded that Finance Minister AMA Muhith resign, saying he lost the moral right to hold the post the moment he admitted that the banking sector was tainted by a series of scams, including some massive thefts.

Making the statement in his closing speech before the supplementary budget's passage on June 7, Muhith also told parliament,

"There were some faults, sometimes there were looting. I want to say the

irregularities were massive at times."

The High Court yesterday granted ad-interim bail to BNP leader Rafiqul Islam Mia and suspended Gazipur City Corporation mayor MA Mannan for six months in two violence cases.

The case against Rafiqul was filed with Shah Ali Police Station in the capital in March last year, while Mannan was shown arrested in April this year in a case filed with Joydevpur Police Station in Gazipur. Yesterday, the HC bench of Justice Md Shawkat Hossain

and Justice KM Kamrul Kader granted bails to the BNP leaders after hearing two separate bail petitions filed by them. Rafiqul has so far got bail in 27 cases from the HC and lower

courts, said his lawyer Raghib Rauf Chowdhury. He could not say whether Rafiqul was arrested in any other cases.

Rafiqul was denied bail and sent to jail by a Dhaka court after his surrender on May 16 this year in nine arson cases filed last year. Mannan's lawyer Abu Hanif told reporters that his client would get released from jail if he was not shown arrested in any other cases.

The LGRD ministry on August 19 last year suspended Mannan after a Gazipur court accepted a charge sheet against him over an arson attack on a bus in the city February 4 the same year. On April 11 this year, the HC stayed the suspension order.

Political will must for MA Mannan get bail ethnic minority rights

JAP President Rabindranath Saren presided over the meeting.

Prof Abul Barakat of Dhaka University said, "Land dispute of the Adivasi people is not an ethnic problem, but rather it is a class problem."

Problems centring around the rights of

the ethnic minority people are everywhere in the world. They along with other oppressed people must come forward to protect their own rights as soon as possible, he added. While addressing the discussion, Dr

Sadeka Halim of the same university said the ethnic people were always excluded from the land surveys... Tipu Sultan MP said, "The Adivasi people took part in all struggles of the country. So

they are our part and their rights must be preserved... Pankaj Bhattachariya, president of Oikya

Nap, said, "Struggle is a must to protect the rights of these people. So all the oppressed must stand together and fight for their rights." "The ethnic minority people are always

being deprived. They must fight for their rights taking inspiration from the Santal Revolution," said Sanjib Drong, general secretary of Jatiya Adivasi Forum.

The Dhaka University authority yesterday announced its proposed annual budget of Tk 664.11 crore for the FY 2016-2017, allocating only Tk 12.16 crore, or 1.83% of the total budget, for research.

The allocation for education and research sector is only 0.17 percentage points higher than that of the last year's revised budget. Education and research sector accounts for only 9.16 percent of the total budget, while the major portion of the budget, 82.54 percent or Tk 548.15 crore, will be spent for salaries, allowances and pensions of

teachers and employees. However, teachers said the small allocation for education and research will narrow quality and

opportunities of research. Moniruzzaman Khondker, director of Centre for Advanced Studies and Research in Biological Sciences of the university, said, "Last year 13 research proposals of our

teachers were selected. As only Tk 5 lakh were

allocated for the centre, I had to distribute the money for all the projects in very small amounts. So a teacher could complete only two or three phases of his or her research. Conducting a masters level thesis

requires Tk 2 to Tk 3 lakh. Many teachers and students cannot conduct a quality thesis owing to such an insufficient

allocation, added Moniruzzaman, a professor of botany. Inadequate funding for

research is one of the reasons for the university to rank low in global standards, he mentioned.

According to the university administration, there are more than 2,000 teachers in 81 departments and over 50 research bureaus and centres at DU.

"Many teachers are being recruited and numerous departments introduced, but quality of teachers is falling. Teachers get promoted without submitting quality research papers," said Sadeka Halim, director, Centre for Advanced Research in Social Sciences.

Foreign cigarettes seized at airport

Customs intelligence yesterday seized 2,500 cartons of foreign cigarettes at the capital's Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport.

They claimed it was the largest seizure in recent times. Smugglers kept the 22 boxes containing 4.95 lakh sticks ready for smuggling by evading a 602 percent tax applicable to foreign cigarettes, said Moinul Khan, director general of customs intelligence.

The boxes were found inside three airplanes arriving from the Middle East, he added.

It takes at least two or three days to complete the registration process. As he could not take leave from office, his vehicle had remained unregistered. Finally he got an opportunity

when the Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) came up with a daylong on-the-spot registration service yesterday. Dozens thronged Rajdhani High

School on Manik Mia Avenue in the capital where it took only 20-30 minutes to register one motorbike. BRTA had advertised the service in

the media. "In the advertisement, BRTA gave detailed instructions of how to

register and which documents to

require.... I came here with all the necessary documents and registered in 30 minutes," Rayhan told The Daily Star. BRTA arranged the service for

the first time, marking United Nations Public Service Day, said officials. Minister Obaidul Quader inaugu-

rated the service around 11:00am and it continued till 3:00pm. "The major aim of the service is to

encourage people to register their motorcycles," said BRTA Secretary Showkat Ali. Around 200 motorcyclists gath-

ered on Manik Miah Avenue, and 85 of them registered, said BRTA officials. The service-takers welcomed the initiative and called for making it frequent.

"Those who had proper documents could easily register. But how

can we give registration to those

who did not have documents?" said Showkat Ali. "I came from Demra.... Arriving

here, I came to know that my documents have some faults. So I could not get registration," said Mohammad Raju, a businessman.

Eminent urban expert Prof Road Transport and Bridges Shamsul Hoque said such on-thespot registration service benefited people, and it would help to reduce the number of unregistered motorcy-He also suggested making on-

> the-spot registration service available for public transport, especially buses. The government has been crack-

ing down on unregistered motorcycles for the last few months in the capital.

According to BRTA, there are 4 lakh registered and hundreds of unregistered motorcycles in Dhaka
