# Disney planning more "Indiana Jones"


Back in March, Lucasfilm announced a new installment of the famous "Indiana Jones" franchise with Steven Spielberg and Harrison Ford. Considering what happened in "Star Wars: The Force Awakens", the actor doesn't have to worry about juggling multiple franchises, though his involvement in this resurgence is still somewhat unclear. Disney CEO Bob Iger (who's Mouse House purchased

Lucasfilm years ago) spoke to Hollywood Reporter on the matters. When asked if there would be an Indiana Jones expanded universe along the lines of "Star Wars", he said, "Not like Star Wars, no. But we hope...right now, we're focused on a reboot, or a continuum and then a reboot of some sort." Regarding Ford's involvement, Iger added, "Well, we'll bring him back, then we have to figure out what comes next."

He did clarify that he expects more films beyond the fifth installment. "I don't think it reaches the scale of the universe of Star Wars, but I see making more," he said. "It won't be just a one-off."

The fifth, still untitled Indiana Jones was announced for a theatrical release beginning July 19, 2019. Spielberg returns to direct alongside "Jurassic Park" scribe David Koepp and original composer John Williams.

She has been part of the industry over two decades and adds that her parameters to select a film have still not changed. "I don't think the parameters have changed much since I started. They are pretty much the same. I am picky and choosy and I need something that I will believe in 300 percent, otherwise I don't think it is worth taking up," says Kajol, who will start working on her home production soon.

#### Character details revealed for Star Wars origin story


As fans anxiously await the release of "Rogue One: A Star Wars Story", the origin tale about how the Rebellion retrieved the Death Star schematics to take down the Empire, new details, released via Entertainment Weekly, offer a closer look at the new characters.

Set before the events of the first "Star Wars: A new Hope", "Rogue One" follows Jyn Erso (Felicity Jones), a galactic outlaw who is given the chance to wipe her slate clean by leading the effort to steal the Death Star plans.

Her team will include Captain
Cassian Andor (Diego Luna), a by-thebook Rebel intelligence officer that
complements the volatile Erso; Chirrut
Imwe (Donnie Yen), a 'warrior monk';
Baze Malbus (Jiang Wen), Chirrut's
protective friend who prefers a blaster
to ancient weapons; Bodhi Rook (Riz
Ahmed), the Rebel squad's hot-headed
lead pilot; and K-2SO (Alan Tudyk), a
powerful security droid who director
Gareth Edwards calls the "the antithesis of C-3PO."

"Kaytoo is a little bit like Chewbacca's personality in a droid's body," Edwards said.

Forest Whitaker also joins Erso's team as Saw Gerrera, who was once part of an insurgent group trained by



Anakin. Mads Mikkelsen will play Galen Erso, Jyn's father, whose doomsday knowledge is sought by both the Empire and the Rebellion

Empire and the Rebellion.
On the opposing side, Ben
Mendelsohn plays director Orson

Krennic, a villain with intentions to use his squad of Death Troopers to take down the rebel uprising while avoiding his enforcer, Darth Vader.

Darth Vader is confirmed to return in "Rogue One". Arguably the greatest

movie villain in Hollywood history, died in "Star Wars: Episode VI". "Rogue One" will open in theatres

on December 16.
