Bangladeshi youth turns himself in to India police

A Bangladeshi youth, who had crossed over into India in the hope of getting a good job there but could not manage one in a month, has surrendered to the West Bengal police.

Dipankar Mistry from Dakop in Khulna was sent to prison on remand for 14

He was arrested by Indian police and taken to Bashirhat subdivisional magistrate's court in North 24 Parganas. The court sent him to Bashirhat subdivisional prison.

North 24 Parganas police superintendent Bhaskar Mukherjee said the Bangladeshi youth surrendered to Basirhat Police Station on Friday night. A case was filed against him under the foreigners' act.

Dipankar Mistry entered the station and asked the duty officer Shampa Dey to arrest him. He told the officer,

Water crisis deepens in Senpara Parbata

Md Shawkat Akbar was hurrying to his friend's house at Monipuri Para, 1km away from his. He was running out of time before Juma prayers Friday. He needed a shower.

For the last few days, Shwakat of the capital's Senpara Parbata has been facing similar situations as a severe water crisis hit the neighbourhood.

"The water crisis has become very severe for the last five days," said Shawkat.

He said his wife also had to bathe in his Mirpur-6 office after returning home from her office.

"I am preparing to move to other area to get rid of this unbearable problem." He said although Dhaka Water vans to different houses.

Supply and Sewerage Authority (Wasa) provided water to the residents through its trucks, it was inadequate.

More than 1,000 families of Senpara Parbata have been suffering from the water crisis for the last couple of weeks. And the situation worsened in the last five days.

"We get water for only 10 to 15 minutes a day," said Akhtaruzzaman, another resident.

It takes two to three days to get a truck of water. "I received one truck of water today although I had applied for it three days ago," he said.

Over 50 jars of water were being provided every day, and the demand had increased in the last one week, said Masud, who sells water in rickshaw-

Amirul Islam, a resident of the area, said he had to purchase 10 jars of water to meet his family's daily need. "I have to spend Tk 600 a day for this," he said.

Yesmin Habib, another resident, said they bought water to drink and fetched water through buckets from reservoir to use it for household chores.

A Wasa official said the absence of a water pump in the area led to the crisis.

"We've already requested locals and public representatives to provide land on which the pump can be set up," he said, adding the official process was going on.

Wasa Managing Director Tagsem A Khan said they were also thinking of setting up a pump in an adjacent area to meet the demand.

Govt to bring more schools under MPO

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid tells JS

The government is trying to find ways to increase the number of schools under the monthly pay order (MPO) system, Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid told parliament yesterday.

"Our lawmakers have been

demanding that more schools be brought under MPO. We will find out a way anyhow in this regard. And we are carrying out efforts to have a solution," he said while participating in the discussion on the proposed budget for the 2016-17 fiscal year.

Joining the budget discussion, ruling Awami League MPs including Whip Atiur Rahman Atik, too, came up with the same

demand. About the much talked debate regarding quality of education, Nahid said it was not true at all that the quality of education did not improve.

"The government's strong move is continuing to further improve the standard of education," noted the minister adding that the government now focused on technical education

and the training of teachers to this end. The number of students in technical and

vocational education marked a rise from 1 percent to 13 percent out of the country's total students over the last seven years, according to Nahid.

Manna's release demanded

Nagorik Oikya convener Mahmudur Rahman Manna has to be released immediately, demanded speakers at a discus-

sion in the capital yesterday. They also sought better treatment of Manna at the discussion organised by Rampura unit of Nagorik Oikya during an

iftar party in Bansree, said a press release. Bangladesher Samajtantrik Dal General Secretary Comrade Khalequzzaman, Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD) General Secretary Abdul Malek Ratan, central committee member and convener of Dhaka City North unit of Nagorik Oikya Shahidullah Kaiser and Sonar Bangla Party general secretary Sheikh Abdun Nur addressed the function, among others.

They alleged that Manna has been kept in jail without

any trial for around 16 months.

They said Manna is suffering from various diseases and the government must take the responsibility if anything happens to him. Plainclothes detectives arrested Manna in the capital on February 24 last year a day after his phone conversation with BNP leader Sadeque Hossain Khoka. In the conversation, Manna was heard talking about strengthening the anti-government movement.
