# 2 Habiganj war criminals seek review of verdict

Two Habiganj war criminals yesterday filed an appeal with the Supreme Court challenging a special tribunal's verdict that had handed down death sentence to one and life term imprisonment to another.

The war criminals are Muhibur Rahman alias Boro Mian, 65, and Abdur Razzak, 63.

International Crimes Tribunal-1 on June 1 sentenced Mohibur to death and Razzak to life-term imprisonment for their crimes against humanity during the 1971 Liberation War.

Another convict Mujibur Rahman alias Angur Mian, 60, who was sentenced to life imprisonment, is yet to file an appeal. The SC will later fix a date for hearing the appeal, he added.

# 192 died countrywide in workplace accidents in last six months

Says Safety and Rights Society survey

At least 192 workers died in 139 workplace accidents in the country in the last six months, said a survey conducted by Safety and Rights Society, an NGO, yesterday. During the same period of 2015, 202 workers died in 147

workplace accidents, according to the survey.

The NGO works for the improvement of workplace health and safety in Bangladesh.

The survey is based on monitoring 26 daily newspapers --15 national and 11 local.

It found 63 workers died at factories, 59 labourers at construction sites, and 42 at different places like hotels, workshops and power supply firms.

Twenty-five transport and three agriculture workers were killed during this period.

During the previous years, electrocution killed 49 people. Fire caused 12 deaths where 25 people died in machinery or hard object falls. Sixteen workers were suffocated to death while three workers were killed in building, wall or roof collapses. Sixty workers died from various accidents including boiler, chemical and gas explosions.

Sekender Ali Mina, executive director of Safety and Rights, said it is the failure of the authorities concerned that they are unable to reduce the workplace deaths.

Dr Shafi retired in 2005 but still delivers classes at the department as supernumerary professor, an honorary position. "I love my colleagues and students. I feel proud to see my students at the Secretariat and govern-

On May 4, the professor made another donation of Tk 30 lakh to the department for development of infrastructure, education and research, bringing the total of his donation to Tk 70 lakh.

When asked about his life's philosophy, Dr Shafi said there were two kinds of life: a happy life and an ideological life.

"Someone seeking to live a happy life only gives importance to the present. He only wants to gain wealth and live in luxury. But the ideological life is based on the past, present and future. A man who leads an ideological life thinks about the time after his death." It is not the first time Dr Shafi donated. In

2010, he created a Tk 10 lakh fund after his parents, "Amena-Latif Trust Fund". The three top scorers of the department of each academic year receive the scholarship.

In 2011, he founded "Professor Muhammed Shafi Trust Fund Fellowship",

master's examinations, at the department.

He also created "Abdul Latif Student Scholarship Welfare Fund" in 2001, at Santahar BP School, where he went, and in the same year founded "Amena Khatun Female Student Welfare Fund" at Ahsanullah Institution in Bogra. Prof Shafi was born on July 22, 1939, in

Santahar of Bogra. After schooling, he studied in Rangpur Carmichael College and then graduated in zoology from Dhaka University in 1960. More than two decades later, after completing his post-graduation at DU and PhD in Glasgow University in the UK, he joined DU, in 1973. Speaking about philanthropy, he said he

learnt it from his father. "In our village, the Muslim population was poor. They could not properly organise festivals like wedding and Akika (naming ceremony). One day father brought 100 plates, large cooking pots, glasses, and spoons so that the neighbours could borrow them."

The incident left a lasting impression on his mind and inspired him to donate.

Dr Shafi now lives with his wife on the capital's Elephant Road.

as a plot to hang onto power," he said.

A similar letter was sent to the head Hindu priest of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission in the capital on June 15. Rizvi said the streets were being stained with blood of

minority people due to the government's failure to ensure security. Terming the recent spree of killings "mysterious", he

said it was evident from the nature of militant activities that the government created them. He also alleged that militant activities had not decreased after the government's special weeklong crackdown.

Rizvi criticised Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for stating that BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia was shedding crocodile tears for militant suspect Golam Faizullah Fahim who was killed in a "shootout" while in police custody.

Khaleda raised questions about the death echoing people's views and emotions, he said, adding, "As a top leader of the country, will not Khaleda Zia talk about public security?"
