Heartbreaking reunion

His plan was to surprise his family with a sudden visit from Qatar to celebrate Eid together.

So, he planned to buy gifts for his wife and two daughters, and decided to fly back home on Friday.

Nurul Amin Mintu even called his wife on Tuesday after Iftar, spoke to his daughters about their wellbeing, and made sure to hide the surprise.

But everything changed the next day. Mintu, who has been working at Ship Dry Dock, a shipyard company in Doha, died from a gas cylinder explosion at his work after he went to inspect it.

What could have been a pleasant surprise turned out to be a tragic reunion for the family members as they received Mintu's body in a coffin at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport early yesterday after the Bangladesh embassy in Doha informed the family about his accident.

"We are very much shocked by his sudden and tragic death," Kamal, Mintu's brother-in-law, told The Daily Star.

Mintu had been working in the United Arab Emirates for 22 years. Returning from the UAE, he went to Qatar in August 2014.

He came to visit on December 18 and stayed for about two months, said Kamal, adding that Mintu again went back to the Gulf country last February.

President tells Bhutanese king

Mentioning that there are many potential areas in Bangladesh and Bhutan, President Abdul Hamid and Bhutanese King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck yesterday said the two countries can tap the opportunities for their further economic development.

They came up with the view at a meeting at the Throne Room of Tashichho Dzong, the office of the king.

During the 30-minute meeting, President Abdul Hamid said Bangladesh and Bhutan has many potential areas which they can use for strengthening their economic development and mutual benefit.

President's Press secretary Joynal Abedin briefed reporters after the meeting.

The Bhutanese king emphasised the need for identifying the possible areas of cooperation and exchanging high-level visits between the two countries.

President Hamid lauded the recent advancement of Bhutan and said the bilateral relations of Bangladesh and Bhutan are getting strengthened through the exchange of high-level visits.

Expressing gratitude for the assistance and cooperation extended by Bhutan during the Liberation War of Bangladesh, the president said Bangladesh sees Bhutan with special honour as it was the first country to recognise Bangladesh after its independence.

Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck highly appreciated the development and progress of Bangladesh and hoped that Bangladesh would be able to maintain this development trend in the future.

Abdul Hamid invited the king and queen to visit Bangladesh. He conveyed good wishes to the newly born member of the royal family Prince Jigme Namgyel Wangchuck.

President's wife Rashida Khanam and Queen Jetsun Pema were also present.

Biman plans big to fly to more destinations

Biman Bangladesh Airlines has worked out a plan to resume flight operations on some of its closed routes along with opening new ones after inducting new aircraft into its fleet.

According to sources at the Civil Aviation and Tourism Ministry and Biman, the national flag carrier has decided to resume its operations on the Dhaka-Delhi-Dhaka and Dhaka-Hong Kong-Dhaka routes in the upcoming winter season.

It also decided to start its operation on the Dhaka-Guangzhou (China)-Dhaka, Dhaka-Colombo (Sri Lanka)-Dhaka and Dhaka-Male (The Maldives)-Dhaka routes during the upcoming winter.

Biman also has the plan to start its flight operations on the Dhaka-Narita (Japan)-Dhaka route during the winter season, among other routes.

The airliner is also in a process to resume the Dhaka-New York-Dhaka route in 2017 if the Civil Aviation Authority, Bangladesh is upgraded to category-1.

Biman is currently operating flights on seven domestic and 15 international routes of the Middle East, Europe and Asia. Biman has four Boeing 777-300 ERs, two Boeing 777-200 ERs, two Airbus A310-300s, four Boeing 737-800s and two Dash-8 in its fleet and is in a move to induct at least two Boeing aircraft under dry lease (only aircraft) system for 60 months.

According to the Biman officials, they will try to get two more aircraft; one will be pressed into service between March and June while another between November and December.

"These aircraft will be used after phasing out of the two Airbus 310-300 from its fleet," said a Biman official.

In 2008, the national flag carrier went into an agreement with a US company for procuring 10 new generation aircraft -- four Boeing 777-300ERs, two Boeing 737-800 and four Boeing 787 Dreamliner. Boeing has already delivered four 777-300ER and two 737-800 aircraft and scheduled to deliver the rest by 2018-19.

Response team to fight cybercrime: officials

The government has decided to form a computer incident response team (CIRT) under Bangladesh Computer Council (BCC) to address cyberattacks, officials said.

They said the Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Division has issued an office order giving mandate to the council CIRT to act as government computer incident response team

under "BGD e-Gov CIRT". "The government is making its best efforts to establish national cyber security incident management capabilities in Bangladesh as cyber crime and cyber attacks have emerged as a threat to digitisation and IT system," said Tarique M Barkatullah, director of National Data Centre.

He said the BGD e-Gov CIRT will manage cyber security incidents in Bangladesh government network and related infrastructure.

Cops arrested my son but they label him a fugitive

Says suspect's father

The father of one of the suspects in the murder of Superintendent of Police Babul Akter's wife Mahmuda Khanam Mitu yesterday claimed that police were denying that they picked him up on June 23.

The case's investigation officer, Assistant Commissioner Kamruzzaman of the Detective Branch of police, said Nur Islam alias Md Rashed is a fugitive along with three other suspects, Md Kalu, Kamrul Shikder alias Musa and Nurnabi. Police issued alerts on the borders on June 29 informing of the fugitives.

Rashed's family told a press conference in Chittagong Press Club that he was picked up around 6:20am from the house of his friend, Elius, at Gostarpar Military area under Boalkhali upazila and Nurnabi was with them.

He had been staying there since June 20 and Elius informed them of the matter, they said, urging to produce him before a court. Though they say he is accused in two cases, they could not give details.

On June 5, three bike riding assailants stabbed and shot Mitu while she was going to put her son on his school bus at GEC intersection in Chittagong city. So far eight people have been arrested.
