Unbearable:

The pain is unbearable for Komakichi Okamura who lost his 32-year-old son Makoto Okamura to Friday's savage attacks on a restaurant in the capital. Makoto is one of the

seven Japanese nationals who died in the militant siege. One survived with a gunshot wound. All eight were working for three Tokyo-based consulting firms on a Japanese government-funded infrastructure project.

"This is something so unbearable as a parent. I have no idea how I can face him, to be honest," Komakichi told the Japanese media in front of his house yesterday. He said he told his son

to be careful before he left. "That was the last conversation I had with him on the telephone."

WATER CRISIS IN WEST SHEWRAPARA I walk half km daily to fetch water

Says resident

Lutfunnesa is a woman on a mission.

Everyday she wakes up early and heads out to fetch water from another area, which is around half a kilometre from her West Shewrapara residence.

Not only does she have to make the trip multiple times while fasting, carrying the heavy load has also become immensely painful for her.

"I have to go through this ordeal to meet the demand of my family everyday," she said.

"It is really painful as I remain tired and my entire body aches," said Lutfunnesa, a resident of Iqbal Road of West Shewrapara.

This has become a regular scenario in the capital's West Shewrapara, where over 1,000 residents are facing a severe water crisis for the last couple of weeks as capacity of a designated pump has been reduced by around 50 percent due to the depletion of the ground water level.

Many have to fetch water from other areas on foot or through rickshaws or rickshaw-vans.

Initially the residents purchased water from Wasa. As the demand grew, residents had to purchase around 20 jars of water everyday spending Tk 800, said Farida, owner of a five-storey building at Pirerbagh Road.

The persons who deliver the water jars take Tk 30 to deliver a jar on the ground floor and Tk 40 for the upper floors, she added.

Restrictions don't stop rawhide supply

Defying all the pressures and many government deadlines, tanneries in the capital's Hazaribagh area are continuing their operation in full swing with regular rawhide supply. Visiting 10-12 tanneries, including Helal

Tannery, Luna Tannery, Milon Tannery, Amin Tannery and LIB Tannery, the news agency has recently found the factories continuing operations normally with rawhide stocks as usual. Saiful Islam, a technician of Milon

Tannery, said, "Our factory is in regular operation. Rawhide supply is now normal. The supply was stalled for 20-22 days."

Supervisor of Helal Tannery Rashed Uddin also said his factory remains in production.

Terrorists had 'Sehri'

The terrorists who stormed a Gulshan restaurant and killed 20 hostages on Friday night opted to have Sehri, the last meal for fasting, with an Italian dish at the restaurant.

Around 2:00am, they directed the chefs to cook for them as they would fast the next day.

After hearing the names of the dishes, the terrorists ordered the chefs to prepare sea bass fillet, an Italian dish, available at that time.

They took the meal and offered them to eat too for fasting, an eyewitness told The Daily Star, preferring not to be named.

· Inspector General of Police (IGP) AKM Shahidul Hoque yesterday said the five : militants whose identities were made public after the Gulshan attack, have links · with the banned militant outfit Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB).

The IGP came up with the information while talking to reporters after visiting two police constables -- Alamgir and Kabir -- injured in the Gulshan attack, at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) in the afternoon.

The attackers whose images were published were involved in militant activities and their identities were found. Police are working to dig out more information, he said. Earlier on Saturday, security forces recovered the bodies of 20 foreign nationals

launching a commando operation at a café at Gulshan when six attackers and two policemen were also killed after terrorists held hostage a good number of people in it. Thirteen people, including a Japanese citizen and two Sri Lankan nationals, were rescued during the operation.

The police headquarters disclosed the names of the deadly attackers on Saturday night. Among the six attackers, five were identified as Akash, Bikash, · Don, Badhon and Ripon, while identity of the rest could not be confirmed.
