

5 killed as launch hits steamer

At least five passengers were killed and 20 others injured in a collision between a steamer and a launch at Charbaria point in the Kirtankhola river early yesterday.

The collision occurred at 4:00am when the BIWTC steamer PS Mahsud was heading for Barisal with passengers on board and triple-deck passenger launch MV Suravi-7 was returning to Dhaka after setting down all passengers.

The steamer was carrying more than 700 passengers, while MV Suravi-7 was almost empty when they collided around five kilometres away from the Barisal port, witnesses said.

Passengers of PS Mahsud who were on the deck for Fazr prayers said Suravi-7 was going on the right side of the river but suddenly changed course to the left and hit the steamer. MV Suravi-7 continued its journey towards Dhaka after SEE PAGE 10 COL 5
