

Asian Cinema Retrospective set to begin

Moviyana Film Society and Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy has organised Asian Cinema Retrospective 2016, set to screen 65 films from 19 countries over a 17- week period beginning this week. The Retrospective will feature discussions on Asian films and noted Asian film makers, says a press release.

Asian Cinema Retrospective will begin on July 15 at 3pm at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy's (BSA) International Digital Cultural Archive Room of National Theatre Hall, with Syed Salauddin Zaki's "Ghuddi".

The sessions will take place on Friday and Saturday from 3-8pm. Every week during the event, three films will be featured, alongside discussions. The event will promote films from Bangladesh, India, Japan, South Korea, China, Iran, Pakistan, Thailand, Iraq, Vietnam, Saudi Arabia, Indonesia and many more.

The event is open for all, but registration is necessary -- which can be done at room number 701 of BSA.

Akshay and SRK book spot on Forbes 100 Celebs List

Bollywood actors Shah Rukh Khan and Akshay Kumar have found spots on the Forbes 100 Highest-Paid Celebrities of 2016.


SRK, with earnings of \$ 33 million, shares 86th place with Iron Man star Robert Downey Jr, Ghostbusters actress Melissa McCarthy, basketballer James Harden and the Dave Matthews Band. Akshay, who made \$ 31.5 mil-

lion, is at number 94 with Brad Pitt and magician team Penn & Teller. SRK, 50, makes the cut because

of "multi-million dollar upfront fees and the cut of the backend' in films like Dilwale," according to Forbes. Part of his earnings also come from high-value endorsement deals.

About 48-year-old Akshay,

Forbes writes that he, "banked top rupee for three hit films in our scoring period" - these are likely "Brother", "Singh Is Bling" and "Airlift". He also advertises prod-



ucts as diverse as motorcycles to a gold loan company.

The list of celebrity top earners is headed by musician Taylor Swift, who made a whopping \$170 million from her 1989 tour, brand endorsements and other highprofile activities. Second and third spots are filled by boy band One Direction and author James Patterson.

One third of this year's list are from outside America - apart from the names mentioned above, these include British singer Adele, Portuguese and Argentinian footballers Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi, Brazilian supermodel Gisele Bundchen and Irish rockers U2.

The only actor to make it to the top 10 on the list is comedian Kevin Hart who is at number six.

'Secret Life Of Pets' Wakes Up Summer's Second Half With \$104M+

This weekend, Illumination Entertainment further proved it's not just an animation label relegated to a Russian-speaking villain and yellow Tic-Tac guys as "The Secret Life Of Pets" came in well above its weekend estimates with \$104.35 million gross, the sixth-best opening in July and second best for an animated

film during the month after last year's "Minions".

In what appeared to be a twonote summer between Disney/Pixar's "Finding Dory" and Marvel's "Captain America: Civil War" (\$406.2M), Pets widened the landscape with the third-best debut of the season, giving way to

what many believe will be a more successful second half of the summer than the first. With an A-CinemaScore, Pets is certain to do a 3x multiple, getting it to \$313M stateside. Minions finaled with a 2.9 multiple at \$336M and made \$1.16 billion globally.


