

UK warns of Brexit 'shadow' on world economy

Britain's finance minister warned Brexit would cast a "shadow" over the world economy but said he was eyeing a free trade deal with China in interviews with the BBC and Sky News on Sunday.
Speaking on the sidelines of the G20 meeting of leading world economies in Chengdu, China, Philip Hammond told Sky that the vote to leave the EU was "not the only shadow the world economy faces".
"There is going to be uncertainty about the outcome hanging over the world economic outlook for perhaps the next couple of years," Hammond said.
"At the same time there are very exciting opportunities opening up with China, with Australia, with India, and with many other countries" once Britain has withdrawn from the EU, he said.
Asked by the BBC if he could envisage a free trade deal with China, he said: "Definitely I could see such a thing."
"We already have a strategic partnership with China... Once we are out of the European Union then I have no doubt on

both sides we will want to cement that relationship into a firmer structure in a bilateral way," he said.
G20 finance ministers on Sunday said the Brexit vote heightened risks for the world economy and vowed to use "all policy tools" to boost growth.
China President Xi Jinping before the referendum had said that he hoped Britain would remain in the 28-nation bloc to promote the "deepening development of China-EU ties."
Senior figures from some of Britain's biggest financial services companies, including HSBC, Virgin Money, the London Stock Exchange and Standard Life were travelling with Hammond.
Prime Minister Theresa May also discussed a trade deal with Australia in a phone call with Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull earlier this month.
Foreign Office junior minister Alok Sharma was also travelling to India on Monday on his first visit since his appointment.
"Britain is open for business and thriving on the world stage. We want the strongest possible relationship with India," Sharma said

Huawei revenue rises 40pc

Chinese telecoms equipment giant Huawei said on Monday that revenue surged 40 percent year-on-year in the first half of 2016, boosted by steady growth in smartphone sales.
Total sales revenue reached 245.5 billion yuan (\$36.7 billion) in January-June, audited results released in a company statement showed. The company did not provide a breakdown of the figures.
"We are confident that Huawei will maintain its current momentum, and round out the full year in a positive financial position backed by sound ongoing operations," Huawei chief financial officer Sabrina Meng said.
Huawei is one of the largest providers of network infrastructure globally, but its consumer products are less well-known outside of China.
Its consumer business, including smartphone sales, has strongly supported the company's performance, soaring 73 percent to 129.1 billion yuan last year.
Huawei had more than eight percent of the world smartphone market last year, putting it in third place behind Samsung and Apple, International Data Corporation (IDC) said in a report this year.
Huawei said in the statement that its consumer business in the first half "maintained steady growth globally". It is set to release sales figures for its smartphone business later this week.
The firm said net profit rose 33 percent year-on-year in 2015, reaching 36.9 billion yuan, adding that revenue for the year was 395 billion yuan, a year-on-year increase of 37 percent.
Huawei is not listed on any stock exchange but it releases financial information in the interest of transparency.

Philips hits Q2 profit, warns global markets 'volatile'

Electronics giant Philips posted a 57 percent jump in second quarter net profit Monday on the back of a major arbitration award, as it warned of volatile markets ahead for the rest of the year.
Net profit surged from 274 million euros (\$300 million) to 431 million euros after Philips was awarded 144 million euros in an international arbitration following a botched deal to sell its entertainment arm to Japan's Funai electronics company.
Philips in October 2013 announced it was breaking off the 150-million-euro sale, accusing long-time business partner Funai of breach of contract.
Philips said the Japanese firm refused "to take the necessary steps to enable completion of the transaction and the transfer of the business," whose products included hi-fi systems and DVD players.
Both manufacturers then filed for damages before the International Court of Arbitration.

Japan in first half-year trade surplus since Fukushima nuclear disaster

Japan on Monday posted its first half-year trade surplus since the 2011 Fukushima nuclear disaster, after the accident sent energy import bills soaring and led to a string of deficits.
The world's third largest economy logged a January-June surplus of 1.8 trillion yen (\$17 billion), against a 1.69 trillion yen deficit in the same period last year, the finance ministry said.
A sharp drop in oil and gas prices took pressure off Japan's trade balance, but exports still struggled to make headway with a sharp rise in the yen weighing on profits among some of Japan's biggest firms.
The six-month surplus was the first since the July-December 2010 period, trade ministry data showed.
The Japanese economy, which was already struggling at that time, was hammered by the quake-tsunami disaster that sparked the accident at Fukushima.
