Eight killed by lightning CITY DESK

Eight people were killed by lightning in four districts yesterday.

In Rangpur, two boys were killed by lightning while they were playing in a field near their houses in Pirgachha upazila.

The deceased were Bijoy Chandra Barman, 10, son of Dilip Chandra Barman and Tinbu Chandra Barman, 12, son of Badal Chandra Barman of Khakharihat village. The boys were cousins.

Meanwhile in Kaunia upazila of the district, two people were killed by lightning when they took shelter under a tin-roofed structure after it began to rain while they were working in a paddy field.

The deceased were Monir Uddin, 60, and Shakil Ahmed, 16, of Langrabazar area.

In Gaibandha, Shariful Islam, 30, of Samoshpara village was killed by lightning while he was working in a field in the village under Gobindaganj upazila.

In Netrakona, Mohammad Alam, 29, of Chhoydun village was killed by lightning while he was working in a field in the village under Kendua upazila.

In Chandpur, Nasima Bagam, 40, was killed by lightning while she was going inside her home from her outdoor kitchen in Dorigon Beribad area of Motlob Uttar upazila.

Meanwhile in Kachua upazila of the district, Billal Prodhan, 40, of Budhunda village was killed while he was working in a field in the village.

AL leader abducted for ransom

An Awami League leader of Bandarban's Lama upazila was abducted for ransom early yesterday.

The victim is Nurul Absar, 52, ward level president of AL of the district.

Victim's son Mizanur Rahman said a gang of 15-18 broke into their house around 2:00am and abducted his father at gunpoint in Hargaja area. "They also looted valuables and cash worth Tk 1.4 lakh," he said. "The gang also looted three of our relatives' houses of valuables worth about Tk 3 lakh.

"One of the abductors phoned me around 10:00am and demanded Tk 8 lakh as ransom."

Iqbal Hossain, officerin-charge of Lama Police Station, said they are trying to rescue the AL leader.

Jakir Hossain, chairman of Fashiakhali Union Parishad, claimed a gang of around 20 from adjacent Chakoria and Ramu upazilas under Cox's Bazar has been conducting such kidnappings in the area for around five years. "We have discussed the matter with law enforcement agencies many times, but to no avail." Superintendent of Police of Bandarban Mizanur Rahman said, "A gang has been operating in the area for quite some time. As they are mostly situated in remote areas, it's hard for us to arrest them. We...will take stern actions against

the abductors."

The rapacious operation of looting of trees from Bhatera reserve forest in Kulaura upazila in Moulvibazar is not only changing the landscape, but also threatening the delicate ecosystem. According to Bangladesh Forest Industries Development

Corporation, Bhatera forest is situated on 2,542 acres of land. But the forest, which is a habitat for many rare species of flora and fauna, is now facing a severe threat due to the rampant tree felling.

Police on Thursday night seized a truck (without any licence plate) loaded with at least 24 logs of illegally felled trees in Bhatera Station Bazaar near the forest.

They also held two Talamiz leaders Bodrul Amin, president of Bhatera Union Talamiz and Abul Hosain Mullah, president of Brahmanbaria Union Talamiz in this connection, said Riaz Uddin, bit officer of Bhatera forest. They were later released, he added.

Abul Hossain, the truck driver, said, the duo paid him for transporting the logs. When asked why the vehicle did not have any licence plate, he did not answer. According to the forest officials, looting and selling of trees

has been going on for a long time. At least 16 pieces of logs were seized in the same area last Friday, they added. While visiting the area, this correspondent found

several remains of trunks of the felled akashmoni and rain trees bearing testimony to the felling and plunder-"We have lived in this forest for generations but are help-

less before these gangs who regularly enter the forest and make away with trees chopped into three-feet logs to facilitate transportation," said Monir Uddin, a local of the area "The loggers often threaten us whenever we try to stop them," he said. Locals claimed that the loggers were influential people of

the area, who often entered the forest in large numbers and carried sharp weapons with them. Md Abul Kashem Bhuyan, range officer of Kulaura, said

they are faced with various problems like shortage of man-

power and some unscrupulous persons are taking advantage of that. "The forest is rich in rare species of plants and animals." But it is getting destroyed by the loggers. We must protect what is left to save the environment," said Abdul Karim

Kim, general secretary of Bangladesh Poribesh Andolon, Sylhet unit. Shamsuddoha, officer-in-charge of Kulaura Police Station, said, "We have seized the truck filled with logs and

had held two Talamiz leaders for questioning." "We are investigating the matter and legal actions will be taken against the perpetrators," said RFM Monirul Islam divisional forest officer of the Sylhet Forest Division.

Contacted, Bodrul Amin said the allegations against him were false, while Abul Hosain Mullah could not be reached despite several attempts.
