INT'L MATH OLYMPIAD Bangladeshi winners accorded reception

Bangladesh Mathematical Olympiad Committee (BdMOC) yesterday accorded a grand reception to the Bangladesh team of International Mathematical Olympiad (IMO)-2016 for achieving silver and bronze medals at the 57th IMO held in Hong Kong this month.

The programme was held in the TCB auditorium at Kawran Bazar of the capital.

The Bangladesh team bagged one silver and three bronze medals, and received two honourable mentions, but narrowly missed the gold medal.

Asif E Elahi of Sylhet MC College was awarded the silver medal, while Ahmed Zawad Chowdhury of Chittagong Cantonment English School and College, Md Sabbir Rahman of Notre Dame College in the capital and Sazid Akhter Turzo of Sirajganj Government College were awarded the bronze ones.

SM Nayeemul Islam of Barisal Zilla School and Md Sanzeed Anwar of Mymensing Anondamohon College received honourable mentions

BdMOC Chairman Prof Jamilur Reza Choudhury, Deputy Managing Director of Dutch Bangla Bank Ltd Saidul Hasan and others congratulated the award winners and their team leaders Mahbubul Alam Majumder and AA Munir Hasan.

BdMOC formed the team after selecting participants from national and divisional-level Olympiads sponsored by Dutch-Bangla Bank Ltd and the Bangla daily Prothom Alo.

Bangladeshi students have been taking part in IMO since 2005 and so far got four silver and 17 bronze medals and 23 honourable mentions.

'Cops assault' on Rampal march protested

National Committee's rallies Aug 20 DU CORRESPONDENT

The National Committee to Protect Oil Gas Mineral Resources, Power, and Ports held a rally in front of the capital's Jatiya Press Club yesterday, protesting Thursday's "police assault" on a procession demanding cancellation of the Rampal power plant project.

Academics and leaders of different left-leaning political organisations participated in the rally.

Speakers at the rally asked the government why the agreement to build the plant was inked disregarding public opinions, when the country was undergoing militant attacks.

Condemning the police assault, the Committee's secretary Prof Anu Muhammad said, "We wanted to submit an open letter to the prime minister, explaining why the committee opposed the project. The prime minister should have heard that following the rules of a democratic government Instead, tear shells were fired and protesters were arrested."

On Tuesday, police allegedly fired teargas on marchers, who were heading towards the Prime Minister's Office with a seven-point demand, including cancellation of the project. The committee also announced to hold rally at Central

Shaheed Minar in the capital and also at districts and upazilas on August 20 to protest the project. After the rally, they brought out a protest procession that

ended in Paltan area. The committee, political parties, green activists and environmentalists have long been protesting the project.

Missing classes don't mean becoming militant

Says Nahid but asks teachers to keep watch on absentees

Urging all to not raise allegations against students over confusions, Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid yesterday clarified that the ministry had in no way meant to say that students absent for 10 consecutive days were involved in militancy when it asked teachers to check up on such absentees.

"...the teachers will contact the guardian. If the guardians show a reason of sickness or say their children are helping them in the field, things will be finished here," he told an award giving ceremony in the capital's Bishwo Sahitto Kendro (BSK).

If the guardians express concerns, the teacher will inform the upazila

education officer, who will pass it on to deputy commissioners. "The DCs will take steps through police and inform us," he said.

The programme, organised under the ministry's Secondary Education Quality and Access Enhancement Project (SEQAEP), saw 153 librarians selected from 40 Dhaka Division upazilas in 2015 being presented "Best Organisers Honorary Award", a cheque worth Tk 4,000, a book and a certificate each.

Nahid viewed book reading programmes as one of the effective ways to resist militancy. "The students should be brought up as a good human being first. For that to happen, they will have to be provided with

good books," he said.

He admitted that the creative question method introduced at secondary level six years ago was yet to bear fruit.

The problem lies in teachers accustomed to the old fashioned education system lacking the eagerness to work on it despite being provided training, he said.

BSK President Prof Abdullah Abu Sayeed said reading books regularly would change students' attitudes, enabling them to love themselves and their country.

With the help of BSK, SEQAEP is implementing a "developing reading habit programme" in 250 upazilas where teachers and librarians are organising and encouraging youths to read books at educational institutions.




