10 SHOUT UIU receives Intersolar Award 2016 in Germany

Director, Centre for Energy Research of United International University, Shahriar Ahmed Chowdhury received the Intersolar Award 2016 in the category of "Outstanding Solar Projects" in Munich, Germany as the team leader for the award winning research project "Pilot PV DC Peer-to-Peer Smart Village Grid". The research team was formed by experts from UIU and ME SOLshare Ltd. of Bangladesh, Technical University of Berlin and Ulm University of Applied Sciences, Germany and University of California at Berkeley, USA.

The "Intersolar Award" is considered as the most prestigious award in the solar industry of the world. Chowdhury is the first Bangladeshi to receive the award.

The pilot research project at Shariatpur, Bangladesh is the world's first peer-to-peer network to allow energy to be shared between private solar installations. The research project was cofunded by World Bank and IDCOL, implemented by SOLshare and is operated by UBOMUS at Shakimali Matborkandi village in Shener Char Union of Jajira Upazila, Shariatpur.
