Ctg BNP grapples with rift over committee

Defing a High Court order. 10 out of 34 pharmaceutical companies that have been ordered to stop marketing of substandard medicines continue to sell their products. Officials at the Directorate General of Drug Administration (DCDA) yesterday said products of the 10 companies were still available in the market. The High Court on Monday ordered the government to take measures so that sales of substandard drugs of 20 medicine companies and antibiotics of 14 others would be stopped. It also asked them to withdraw those products from the market. The 10 companies are Avert Pharma Lid, DIMUNIAN BARILL, Cig.

The formation of Chittagong city BNP committee has led to discontent within the party as many leaders feel they are not valued in the party. Leaders are also frustrated that the city unit's full-fledged committee could not be formed in the last twelve years. Gulshan area

Commuters in the city's Gulshan, Banani and Niketon areas can let out a sigh of relief as the authorities yesterday alunched 500 special rickshaws and 20 air-conditioned buses to operate there.

On the back of these rickshaws, painted yellow and black, a list of fares for ride to 20 destinations is attached to spare the passengers the hassle of bargaining. For example, the fare from Road No-1 to Road No-14 in Gulshan-1 is TS, from Gulshan-1 intersection to Kaloli intersection Tk 40 and Gulshan-1 intersection to Raloni intersection The 18 and 18 contains a set of directives from the authorities.

The directives say rickshaw-pullers must not demand The directives say rickshaw-pullers must not demand additional fares; they must carry passengers to wherever they want to go within the areas; must wear particular uniform and put their ID cards, provided by the authorities, around their neck; and must not carry more than two adults. Besides, the rickshaw-pullers have been asked to call hottine number 0.1715882117 to inform anything they consider suspicious.

The ACD uses are expected to mitigate the transport crisis that ensued as the police banned bus operations in Culshand Banani over security concerns following the murders of 22 people, including 17 foreigners, in the July-1 calé attack.
