

Tagore remembered at JKKNIU

...... The Music Department of Jatiya Kabi Kazi Nazrul Islam University (JKKNIU) in Trishal upazila organised a cultural show marking the 75th death anniversary of Nobel Laureate poet Rabindranath Tagore on Wednesday evening (August 10).

The artistes rendered the most popular songs of the bard with great applause from the capacity packed Theatre Hall auditorium of JKKNIU.

The artistes of the department joined the rendition of solos and choruses. Poetry recitation that interspersed the

song, made the evening more enjoyable. Earlier, a discussion on the life and works of the poet was held.

Vice-chancellor of the university Prof Dr. Mohit Ul Alam was the chief guest. Treasurer of the university Professor

AMM Shamsur Rahman, Jatiya Rabindra Sangeet Sammilon Parishad Mymensingh's president Professor Monjurul Alam of Bangladesh Agricultural University; Ahmed Shakil Hashmi and Professor Md Jahidul Kabir of Music Department addressed the discussion, among others.

Professor Mosharrat Shobnam, the

head of the Music Department presided over the session.

The Bengali Department of the university also organised a cultural programme and a discussion marking the death anniversary of the bard at the same venue on August 9.

The artistes of the department took part in the cultural programme that included rendition of Tagore songs and a poetry recitation session.

Dean of Arts Faculty Professor Md Mahbub Hossain and Professor Md Sahabuddin of Bengali Department also spoke on the occasion.

The speakers said greater appreciation of the writings of Tagore, especially his songs, will enrich our knowledge of Bengali Literature.

More tours to places gripped with the memories of Tagore will inspire the younger generation to about the bard, his work and contribution, they also said.

They urged teachers, students and artistes of the university to be dedicated to Tagore, a poet who cultivated all branches of Bengali literature. They also termed Tagore as the greatest of great poets of all times.


stages "Surak"

Kamar Ahmad Simon leads Open Doors Hub

On August 10 the Open Doors Hub programme concluded, with the announcement of winners after five days of activity for eight emerging producers, says a press release. The 2016 edition sees the launch of a three-year cycle that Open Doors will devote to eight countries in southern Asia: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, the Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. The prizes conferred aims to support production and

development.

The winners are: the winner of a Production Grant (30,000 CHF) is "Day after Tomorrow" by Kamar Ahmad Simon, Bangladesh; Production Grant (20,000 CHF) "The Red Phallus" by Tashi Gyeltshen, Bhutan; CNC Prize (8,000 Euro) "Season of Dragonflies (Jhyalincha)" by Abinash Bikram Shah, Nepal.

Tisha appears in the play in various guises -- an ordinary girl against an exotic Arabian backdrop, set in a time far from the present. "The story of Jim and Genie is beautiful and I feel really happy with my role," said Tisha.

The play is about a youth who stumbles upon a magical bottle from which a girl -Genie--emerges. The youth then asks the girl to fulfill his three wishes. The genie

agrees and events unfold from that point on. Muntasir Bipon describes the play as "romantic fantasy."

As Deadline reports, Steven Soderbergh, who helmed 2001's 'Ocean's Eleven' remake and sequels


the principal cast.










Aamir Khan and Amitabh Bachchan to act in 'Thug'





Actors Amitabh Bachchan and Aamir Khan will team up for the first time in Yash Raj Films' next project, to be directed by Vijay Krishna Acharya. The film has reportedly been tentatively titled Thug.

Early reports suggested that the makers of Thug were in talks with Hrithik Roshan, who apparently turned the film down due to some reservations. Subsequently, it was speculated that Deepika Padukone and Nawazuddin Siddiqui were joining the cast. However, it seems that Bachchan and Aamir will co-star in the film.

In spite of their distinguished filmographies and string of admired performances, the two actors have never worked together before and now that their names being attached to the film, Thug is being touted as a bigger project than it would otherwise be.

Thug is being described as an action-adventure, inspired by novelist Philip Meadows Taylor's 1839 book, Confessions of a Thug. Set in the pre-Independence era, it chronicles the widespread 'thug' culture of that time.
